Wintario grants funds to Halton Hills groups

Money from those \$1 Wintario tickets you purchase is coming back in the form of \$8,356 to eight different organizations in the Halton Hills area.

The local allotment is part of the 26 cultural and recreational facilities activities receiving \$40,937 in the regional municipality of Halton.

A grant of \$3,998 to the Canadian Tennis Federation (Ontario), located in Norval, is the largest sum coming this way. The money will be used to assist travel and accommodations costs to attend the Canadian Tennis Federation Nationals.

Also in Norval, the Community Association will receive \$267 for the purchase of recreational equipment.

The Over the Hill Fastball League in Georgetown will have \$1,624 worth of new soft-

ball equipment for their nine teams, thanks to Wintario.

Another \$605 will go into the Georgetown area for the Esqueping Historical Society to share in the cost of printing a book on the history of farm life in Esqueping and Erin Townships.

Acton ticket buyers get their return in the form of a \$1,169

grant to the tennis club for new equipment. As well, the Acton Condo Sports Association is \$667 closer to the purchase of softball equipment.

The Halton Hills Operation A.C.T.I.O.N. will recoup \$132 for costs involved in hosting of the Mayor's Annual Road Race. They will also receive \$65 to help defer the costs of a jogging clinic.
