

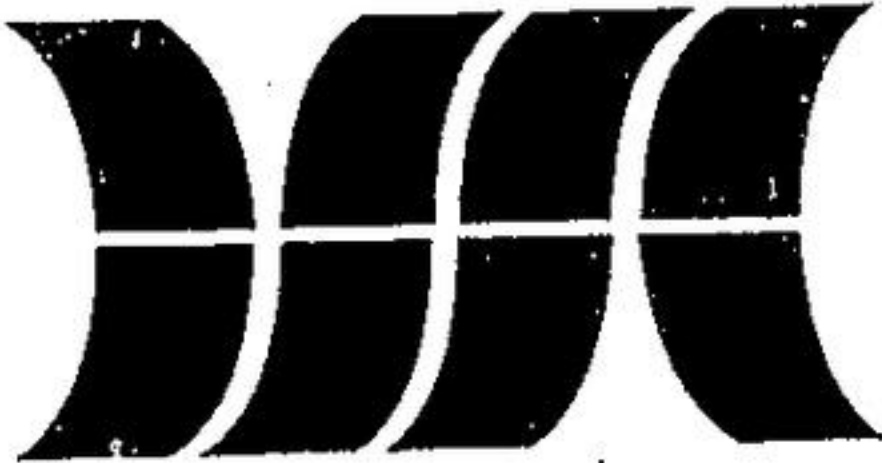
Halton Hills Arts Council
