

Swim club opens season with first victory over three teams

Georgetown went into the fourth annual York Yeo-Women Invitational swim meet on Saturday as the reigning champions, and came out in second place, losing against Queen Elizabeth Park (Oakville), by only 3 points.

Georgetown entered two teams in this meet, an "A" team, comprised mainly of senior swimmers and seasoned swimmers, and a "B" team made up of a lot of junior and first year swimmers. The A's finished second and the B's ninth of 18 teams.

York is always an important meet, as it is the first meet of the year, and it gives a lot of girls a chance to test themselves against other swimmers, and for those on the "B" team, it gives many of them their first experience at a swim meet.

The fact that Georgetown could enter two full teams and have them do so well is very important. Coach Shirlene Pella said proudly that, "other teams were impressed that we had two complete teams entered, most teams had trouble finding one this early in the season."

This meet is unusual in the scoring system; two swimmers from each team are entered in each race, with the totals of the two deciding the points. Thus if one swimmer finished first, and one ninth, they would add the two times and go by the total.

Georgetown encountered a few difficulties in this way of scoring, as we had no-one entered in the 400 metre free style, and had two disqualifications, that resulted in receiving the last place time,

plus one second.

Coach Pella was pleased with the results of both teams, especially those of the "B" team, some swimmers who swam just as well as the "A" swimmers.

The (B) team has "lots of potential, and looks very promising," said Coach Pella, "some of the times were quite good, and it's early in the season."

ROOKIES STRONG

The team's rookies this year are the strongest we've ever had, and "the enthusiasm from last year has carried on. This meet showed that there are a lot of new kids with a lot of talent." One of the reasons that the rookies have done so well is that they had special training before regular training started, where they just worked on strokes. "Getting

the basics down makes a lot of difference," said Coach Pella.

Several girls placed very well. Cheryl Thompson placed first in the 100 metre and third in 100 metre free style. Heather Michie had a third in 50 metre fly and 100 backstroke. Karen Coleman was second in 100 metre breaststroke and Suzanne Albray, second in 50 metre free. Noell Jefferson came third in 100 metre breaststroke, and first place in both the junior and senior free style relays which consisted of Suzanne Albray, Debbie Newman, Heather Gibbs, Cheryl Thompson, Marylynn Morrow, Rose Bydevate, Brenda Braun and Kim McLeod. Good effort was also put out by Liz Ramsay, and Erin McTyre.

The team continues to train daily for their meet.
