country where we could get our democratic rights, if we needed them but we haven't in this case.

"We still can't figure out what the government and Hydro have to hide. It's a crown corporation hiding behind obscure cabinet rulings without just reason. I would hope another government would be more understanding. Ontario Hydro must have sold this government a bill of goods because they're in it together. The government has allowed Hydro to take away the civil rights of taxpayers in this town."

LOSE POWER
Mr. Gardhouse reported that landowners are all concerned that they will lose their bargaining power once the towers are under construction. Hydro negotiators are already visiting farmers trying to work out deals, even though the bylaw may not be in effect yet, he said.

Less than half a dozen property owners in Halton Hills have completed their negotiations, Mr. Gardhouse noted, adding that it will be a long time yet before everything is settled. Although he does not condone violence and neither does anyone else in the ICG, it is prolonged situations such as this which often lead to such confrontations, and he hopes they won't occur in Halton Hills.

"The upsetting part of it all is that it's our future we have to plan for," Mr. Gardhouse commented, "and we can't at this point. Once one line goes through there's always the potential for more. We don't want any construction underway until the settlements have been reached. Once construction is begun, they're in no hurry to negotiate. They have what they want and the landowners can wait."

Act, which would require hearings on projects such as this to determine their effect on the environment.

"Then, after the act was passed, Ontario Hydro said they wouldn't take that into consideration because the project was set out prior to the effective date of the Act," Mr. Reed said. "No hydro project yet has been subjected to environmental assessment hearings."

"As long as the Power Corporation Act is not amended, as long as the government is prepared to exempt hydro projects from the Environmental Assessment Act, as long as the minister of energy isn't accountable for Ontario Hydro, and as long as the Premier continues to hold this faith in electric power saving us in the energy crunch, then Ontario Hydro will continue to play the same old games and get away with it."

"Of the Interested Citizens' Group's determination to continue its opposition to the corridor, Mr. Reed said his "commitment was to go to the wall with these people and that's what I'm going to do."
