"Then, after the act was passed, Ontario Hydro said they wouldn't take that into consideration because the project was set out prior to the effective date of the Act," Mr. Reed said. "No hydro project yet has been subjected to environmental assessment hearings."

"As long as the Power Corporation Act is not amended, as long as the government is prepared to exempt hydro projects from the Environmental Assessment Act, as long as the minister of energy isn't accountable for Ontario Hydro, and as long as the Premier continues to hold this faith in electric power saving us in the energy crunch, then Ontario Hydro will continue to play the same old games and get away with it."

Of the Interested Citizens' Group's determination to continue its opposition to the corridor, Mr. Reed said his "commitment was to go to the wall with these people and that's what I'm going to do."
