Or one that you may think will stand them in good stead with the behemoths of the deep next season. Normark makes the Rapala Fat Rap and you may be sure these are among the finest of lures and come in various sizes and colours. Or try their well known floating Rapala in the rainbow trout colours, hot stuff you can be sure. These lures can be used now as there is still lots of open water and they are the type that large rainbow trout and salmon feed on at this time of year.

### EXCITEDLY WAITING

Finally, after three years from their first news release, Normark has their Compass in production. They ran into a snag with the company that was contracted to make them and are now set to supply the market that is excitedly awaiting them. They come in both Wrist model and a Pin-on-Pocket model and will float if dropped overboard. Being liquid filled these compasses are fast settling into the position (north) and as you know everyone should carry a compass in the field or on the water. An excellent gift of course.

Did you get your hands on a pair of snowshoes last year?? Then you already know of the great times and convenience that go along with their use. Why not buy someone else a pair and enjoy them together. They make a tremendous gift and come in various sizes and styles. If you are looking for a general purpose snowshoe, try the Green Mountain, sometimes called the Modified Bear Paw. They will handle almost everything except deep powder snow and heavy bush conditions. For this type of use then you need the Maine (or Michigan) model or possibly the Alaskan for deep snow. Chosen wisely and properly cared for, good snowshoes will last many years and will give season after season of dependable use. I have a pair that are probably fifty-years-old, although they were neglected before I got them and are patched and they still give service. However, I would like to get a new pair and retire these to the antique wall of my rec-room.

### LETTER TO MINISTER

The Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters have forwarded another letter to Hon. J. Auld, Minister of Natural Resources about the salmon fishery. It is the intention of the Hatchery Supervisor to discontinue all stocking of salmon in the Great Lakes. A resolution was forwarded with this letter indicating the OFAH's feelings on this matter and are in need of your support. If you wish the salmon fishery to continue, then write to your MP and tell him, then write to the Federation and tell them of your support.

This resolution indicates the desire of the majority of the OFAH that the "Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources continue and improve its salmon stocking programs". With this in mind consider the sale of the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters annual tickets. The first and second prizes are identical, a CJ5 JEEP with Convertible top valued at \$7500. There are a total of 23 prizes plus early bird and sellers prizes. The proceeds go to conservation projects of the Federation. The annual convention comes up in February, the 21st to the 24th to be exact. # Fire Safety pee wees extend winning streak

The Georgetown United Fire Safety minor pee wee team extended its current winning streak to five games this week with a pair of tight wins. They won 2-1 over Chinguacousy and 4-3 over Guelph.

At home to Chinguacousy, at Memorial Arena, the pee wees let Ching open the scoring in the first three minutes of the game. It was the only goal of the period and the only goal for Ching as Georgetown shut the door on them the rest of the game.

Brian Doherty tied the game at 7:04 in the second with assists going to Scott Campbell and Chris Hodgins. Hodgins won the game in the third, at the 14:00 mark, assisted by Chris Stevens and Doherty.

Mark Howie played his usual strong two-way game controlling much of the play and enabling the local side to get many chances on goal. Mark Pries also played an outstanding game on defense, his best this season.

Sunday's game in Guelph was a see-saw battle that had each one of Georgetown's goals answered by Guelph, except the eventual winner in the third period.

Mike Teetzel from Jon Hammer and Brian Doherty at 9:17 put Georgetown in front to start the game. That was the only goal the first two thirds of the game. In the third, Guelph replied at 4:29, just 40 seconds before Doherty from Hodgins and Campbell put the Fire Safety team back in the lead. Not for long. Guelph came back at 8:24 to tie it at two. Teetzel took care of that by scoring his second of the day at 10:08 assisted by Pat Braund and Doherty. Guelph didn't waste any time either, and scored at 10:58, once again tying the game.

With 48 seconds remaining in the game, and looking like a hard fought tie, Mark Howie brought his teammates to their feet with the winning goal that beat a tough Guelph goaltender. Hurley and Braund got the assists.

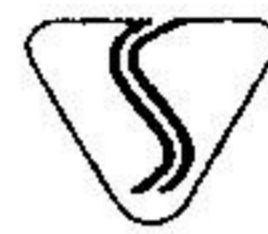
Georgetown had the edge in shots 30-10. Three of those
