# Girls' choir formed



HOUSE SOL

Nestled between mature trees on Charles Street, Georgetown, sits an Art Gallery exhibiting many arts and crafts by several artists.

At a recent Christmas show, the viewer observed pencil drawings by Elizabeth Heinen in a delicate style. The illustrations in the book "Sunflakes and Snowshine" by ClaudetteBoulanger, drew attention as we moved on to vivid oils by Anton Lassing, coupled with a large oil by local artist, Frank Black entitled "Burricane Force" which he created in bright colors.

Bob Kayanagh showed large ceramic designs and Maria Jennings, one of our local artisans, displayed a gorgeous woven vest, cushions and purses. A Toronto artist, Alan Perkins, showed enamel on copper technique in warm colors.

In a different vein, the metal bird sculpture by Andreas Drenters captured the viewer's Interest along with Doris Keszeli's art dolls, which are beautifully crafted in materials that eatch the eye.

Christmas decorations by local neighborhood arts and erafts people were displayed creating a festive environ-

Marjorie Nazer's oils in wide awake colors and decisive lines also drew attention together with her hand-embroidered items and watercolors, which exhibit definite line and color.

John Mattar of Guelph showed water colors in warm shades and subtle design. Wreaths and other Christmas decorations crafted by Janet Beck were on show. A Toronto artist , Thea Weller, displayed copper plate

with silver thread fused onto the plate which is then filled with liquid glass to complete this interesting design. This technique is called cloisonne.

Handpainted fans by Brooke Gibson, together with handpainted scarves by Robert Patterson, were artistically arranged as well as lithographs by Mr. Patterson. Sybil Rampen showed beautifully embroidered birds

and Camille McGuire's drawings of Fantasy animals in simplistic style were greatly appreciated. House Sol has had a place in this community for 17

#### Committee approves guidelines

Halton region's planning committee has approved in principle a set of environmental impact guidelines for inclusion in the official plan.

The guidelines were prepared through consultation between provincial agencies and the region's Ecological and Environmental Advisory Committee, as required by the regional plan, adopted September 6, 1978.

The purpose of the guidelines, according to a staff report, is to explain the procedure to be followed when an environmental impact assessment (EIA) is required by the regional plan and to specify the content of the EIA.




