Halton Women's Place haven nears completion

Halton's Women's Place, a planned hostel for abused wives and their children, is coming closer to completion, but the fund-raising continues in an earnest attempt to reduce the organization's operating deficit.

Georgetown's Peggy Balkind, vice-president of the organizing committee, said the group has sent out letters to professional people and businesses throughout Halton region outlining the purpose of the hostel, and including a flyer and a summary of the feasibility study conducted on the hostel.

"We hope to catch their Christmas spirit," Mrs. Balkind said. "That doesn't cover the vast majority of people out there, and anyone who would like to give a donation can do so at the legal clinic or at the Acton Community Services Centre."

The hostel can't hook into the United Way organization until it has been running for a couple of years, because the United Way prefers to sponsor established charities, Mrs. Balkind said.

The hostel is now, with its projected yearly budget, facing a deficit of \$30,000, and the organization is seeking donations from all possible sources. They are also looking for volunteers to work with the organization, she said.

Mrs. Balkind said things are proceeding with the work on the hostel, and the tentative opening date is April 1, although that may be moved back to May 1 if renovations aren't completed in time.

Tree bylaw left stuck on a limb

A long-awaited bylaw that would restrict and regulate the destruction of trees in Halton region has been deferred until regional solicitor Dennis Perlin can perfect the wording.

Regional council approved last week a planning committee recommendation to defer the Halton tree conservation bylaw and instruct Mr. Perlin to meet with the director of planning and prepare a complete report and a suitable draft bylaw to be reviewed at the next committee meeting.

Coun. Roy Booth of Halton Hills, chairman of the committee, said that the solicitor had written him indicating there were a few items in the proposed bylaw, as written, that he could not support.

"We'd like to delay it just a little while until the solicitor can perfect the legal language of the bylaw", Coun. Booth said.

Coun. Laurie Mannell of Oakville spoke against the deferral.

"We've been hosing around with this tree bylaw since council was formed in 1974 and we still keep sending it back", he said. "Why don't we just forget it."
