In the Ontario Energy Board report released Dec. 21 on its two-year study of Hydro's principles of costing and pricing, the board states that "the validity of economic efficiency advanced by Hydro as the theoretical support for marginal-cost pricing is rejected by the board as not being a measurable, achievable, or a valid goal for Ontario Hydro.'

The report confirms that Hydro has a "lack of comprehensive data on customer response and impact "and says Hydro was unable to assist the board in identifying the effects of their rising prices.

It recommended that Hydro should improve its data bank and develop adequate forecasting methods as well as doing studies on load management and time differentiated
