had lost cattle, as some area farmers have, to rabid foxes, he might feel differently about trapping.

"The reason a problem now exists with rabid foxes is due to the bounty on foxes that the province introduced several years ago", Mr. Hughes responded. "When the fox population was depleted in southern Ontario, foxes began heading south from the northern areas and these foxes had a higher incidence of rabies than the ones that had been

killed." Coun. Ross Knechtel suggested that since Halton Hills is 80 per cent rural and forest area, the potential danger to pets is not that great.

Mr. Hughes pointed out that a similar situation exists in Mississauga several years ago, when it, too, thought its rural nature precluded the need for any trapping bylaws.

"The time to introduce a bylaw is now, not later", Mr. Hughes said.

Council took no action Monday on the presentations.
