## "PROGRAMS! Get your programs"

Each week Raider fans are offered a copy of the Raiders' official program. The program, like those of most teams, provides some articles of fan interest and the lineup for the game.

This is when the similarity ends - the Raider program is a real bargain of value and information. Included in it:

A) The fan benefits from 17 opportunities to win merchandise or services, far in excess of the price of the program.  
B) Some ads in the program are redeemable with the merchant for products, again in excess of the value of the program.  
C) The Purchaser could win a trip to Florida at the end of the season.

D) Each program purchased, by a fan for 25 cents sends a donation to a local Boy Scout troop who sell the programs on a commission basis.

E) The team raises a major portion of its annual operating costs through the sales of ads in the program. These funds are raised prior to the team starting the season and represent an excellent guide to the executive as to what kind of an 'economic year' the team will enjoy.

F) Information to fans:

- 1 Updated line-up compiled on day of the game.
- 2 Accurate league and team statistics.
- 3 A coming events informa-

tion centre which enables fans to keep informed of future Raider happenings.

4 The advertisements provide the fan with a list of businesses which are willing to re-invest in the community.

G) The contract to produce the program is a significant order for the local printer who produces the program. This is again a benefit to the local business scene.

H) The solid base the programs funds provides the team with, enables the executive to work a balanced planned budget without the emergency-poor planned project sometimes supported in vain by the community.

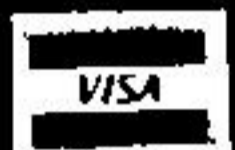

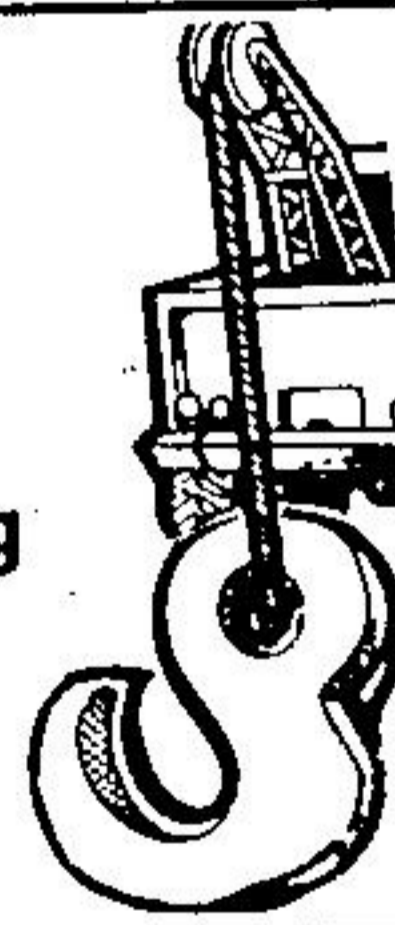
