

Sponsors to discuss why

Refugee families delayed

Sponsors and would-be sponsors of Vietnamese refugees in Halton Hills will be meeting tonight (Wednesday) at St. John's Church for a progress report on the settling in of the families already here and anticipated arrival of more refugee families.

The last refugee family to arrive in Halton Hills came in December. There are 12 sponsor groups in the town, and to date only five families have arrived. Brenda Gogan, a member of one of the groups, said some of these groups have been waiting since July for their families. Tonight's meeting will give the groups a chance to find out how each of

them stands, she said. Mrs. Gogan said the meeting will also include a discussion of some of the difficulties the sponsor groups have encountered getting their families

settled in. She said that prior to the arrival of the family her group sponsors, some people from Toronto, met with them to discuss problems they might encounter.

"It was very helpful but we also encountered problems they hadn't mentioned," Mrs. Gogan said. "We feel it might be helpful to discuss these things together with the other

groups whose families haven't arrived yet, so they can be prepared."

The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the hall at St. John's Church.

Tickets for the celebration, which will be held at Central Technical School on Harbord

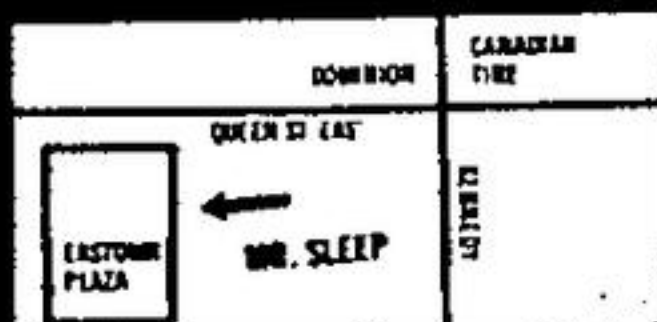
