Violence is not the OHA's concern with experimental checking rules

Time for change?
During the 1979-80 hockey season, two major experiments have been introduced involving a modification of playing rules. These will be monitored during the course of the season and the results analyzed to determine the value of such changes.

The most controversial

proposal seems to be the "No Body Checking" rule which is being tried in the following branches-associations: MTHL, NOHA, TBAHA, ODHA, ODMHA. This indicates a willingness by these associations to modify the rules.

Why the rule change?
Basically it is felt that when players are beginning their hockey "careers" it is important to provide an

environment which is conducive to the learning of the basic skill fundamentals of skating, shooting, passing, etc. Introducing the use of the body at this age of development seems to retard the process of skill learning. It is like learning to drive in downtown Toronto at rush hour.

"Violence" is not an issue in the introduction of this rule. It is a sincere effort to

allow players to practice and learn the basic skills during their games, and to ensure that their skating, puck control, and confidence are well developed before hitting is introduced.

Referees have been instructed to use the following guidelines in the application of this rule: "a minor penalty shall be assessed any player who intentionally uses his body to check an oppo-

nent"

INTERPRETATIONS
...accidental contact between two players going for the puck is not to be penalized.
...hip and shoulder checks must be penalized.
... "riding off" a player is permitted provided the player is not taken directly into the boards.

The boarding signal will be used when calling the penalty.
