Glen dam costs rising

The price tag on alterations to the paper mill dam in Glen-Williams may go up another \$35 (MK)

The design firm of Totten, Sims, Hubicki, Consultant Associates Ltd., which is designing the alterations to the dam, is recommending the

addition of a second sluice to the dam, partly to permit the passage of fish, and to further alleviate the ice-jamming problem.

The second sluice gate will cost an additional \$35,000, of which Halton region's share would be \$7,087.50. This would bring the total cost of the dam

renovations to \$140,000. The design consultants have

said the total effect of the two sluices would be almost equivalent to removing the dam altogether. At the Credit Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA) meeting Thursday, CVCA general manager Glenn Schnarr told Halton Hills

Mayor Pete Pomeroy the consultants were saying that if the town left the dam in because of fears about flooding in Norval if it were removed, they might want to think about it again.

The addition to the dam has not been formally presented either to the authority or to the lown yet for a decision.

French trial May 6

A Georgetown man and two from New Brunswick will appear in Milton provincual court May 6 in two separate proceedings conducted entirely in French.

Alphonse Laroque, 73, of Georgetown, Reginald Michaud, 22, and Albe Michaud, 21, both of New Brunswick, requested trials to French under an amendment in the Criminal Code, which went into effect in Ontario January 1.

Mr. Laroque was charged with impaired driving August 30, and with baving more than the permitted tevel of alcohol in his blood. The two men from New Brunswick have been charged with theft over \$200.

Mr. Laroque, a native of New Brunswick, explained that he speaks some English, but feels more confortable with French. His lawyer, John Belleghern, requested that the trial be conducted in French when Mr. Laroque

appeared in court January 2. Chief Judge Frederick Hayes has not appointed a judge to bear the case as yet. He intends to send in a bilingual court staff as well.


