



Camerata returns to Georgetown next Wednesday

Community awaits return of Camerata

CAMERATA was the resident ensemble at the Shaw Festival in Niagara-on-the-Lake for three seasons, and it was there that the group's concerts made that festival's music program one of the most widely talked about in the country.
Halton Hills Arts Council is proud to present CAMERATA in our community next Wednesday evening.

CAMERATA is a word now synonymous with explorative programming concepts which have seen the ensemble joined by illustrious artists from various disciplines, such as Maureen Forrester, Moe Koffman, Glenn Gould, Tony Van Bridge and many others. CAMERATA is a group of internationally-known soloists, who have between them toured in 29 countries. The ensemble, which tours regularly in Canada, served as Cultural

Ambassadors by accompanying former Prime Minister Trudeau to inaugurate cultural relations with Mexico, Cuba and Venezuela. During the summer of 1977, CAMERATA made two triumphant tours to Europe, playing at London's Queen Elizabeth Hall, at the Harrogate and Three Choirs Festivals of England, in Paris, including recordings for Radio-France, and also gave performances in Holland and Romania.

In the spring of 1970, CAMERATA launched a series of concerts at Casa Loma in Toronto which proved so successful that a second series was given in 1979 and now a third series is being planned for this year. Also in this season, CAMERATA will perform across Canada from the Yukon, to Alberta, to Ontario, to the Maritimes, as well as celebrating Beethoven's birthday with a special concert in Toronto which will be heard on CBC Radio at a future date.

CAMERATA has recorded three albums, two for CBC and one for Crystal Records of Los Angeles. A fourth record for Golden Crest Records of New York will be recorded this June.

The most wonderful thing about CAMERATA is that the musicians love what they are doing, and this enthusiasm for their music is definitely contagious.

When CAMERATA makes a return visit to Georgetown next Wednesday, February 27, at Holy Cross Church, an atmosphere of early Canadian drawing-room entertainment will be created.

As the audience turns back the hands of time, CAMERATA will help all to capture earlier days in Canada, when friends gathered together for dinner, after which they retired from the dining-room to drawing-room or "parlor", where they relaxed and enjoyed good music.

CAMERATA brings to Halton Hills an outstanding Canadian Heritage concert, one which will enrich this community culturally and leave us with an awareness of "musical magic". As the years follow, CAMERATA will remain a fond memory as an extremely innovative musical ensemble.

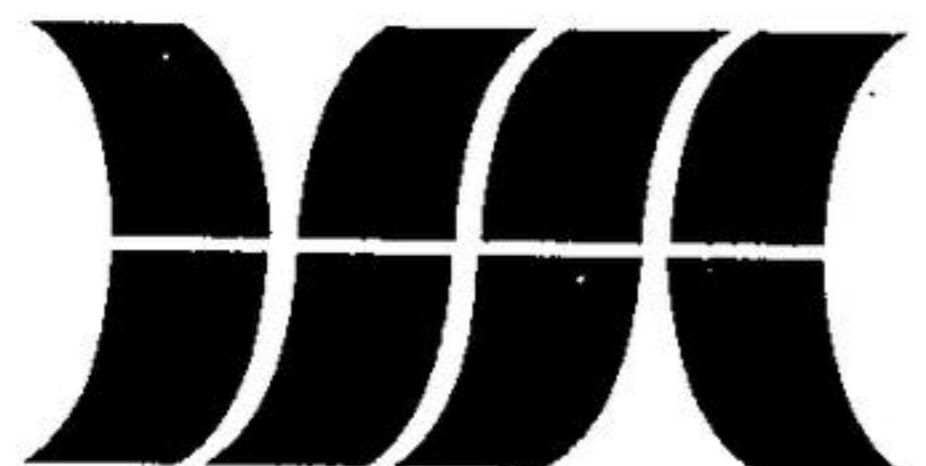
