Made in Quebec

One of the best ways to get a feeling for a new community is to get a close look at what makes it tick economically. More and more vacationers are discovering that visits to local industries. whether it be an artisan's workshop or a major manufacturing plant, are among their most interesting travel

experiences Not all industries provide tours or even welcome guests, but a surprising number do, and many others have museums or shops that tell their story, as well as sell their products.

The industries of the province of Quebec are fascinating in their variety. Visit a few and you will learn much about the people of French Canada.

In Canada the word Ski-doo is almost synonymous with the word snowmobile. The reason is simple. The popular little snow machine was invented in Quebec and for quite a while it was the only one buzzing around the province's snowbanks.

Even today, 20 years after the first Ski-doo took to the snow, many of the world's 1.5 million snowmobiles are Skidoos.

It is a tribute to the inventive genius of J. Armand Bombardier, a mechanic from Valcourt, Quebec, who built his first snow machine in 1922 when

he was only 15. Today, his company and its affiliates employ 7,000 in Canada and abroad and, besides Ski-doos, they make motorcycles, sailboats, subway cars, tramways, locomotives and other industrial

and recreational equipment. . The Ski-doo is responsible for the birth of a relatively new sport: snowmobiling, the third-fastest growing sport in America, after tennis and skiing There are 10 million active snowmobilers on this continent and 10 million more are occasional

snowmobilers. The Bombardier Museum at Valcourt, 35 km west of Sherbrooke along Highway 222, is open year round. It displays many of J. Armand Bombardier's inventions, from the mechanical toys he designed as a child to the giant logging machines of today'

HAND-MADE ROWBOATS

To many Quebecers, a rowboat is a vercheres. The reason for this is that, for 120 years, E. Desmarais Reg'd, of Vercheres, 30 km east of Montreal on the St. Lawrence River, has been making these sturdy boats.

The founder's grandson, Jean Desmarais, now retired, hves next door to the plant which is run by his two sons and three employees. Together, they make 500 boats a year Most of them are sold in Quebec although Ontario residents buy some as well

Mr Desmarais says his grandfather lived on an island near Vercheres and just had to have a strong boat to travel back and forth to the mainland When area. residents began ordering hoats from him in ever increasing "numbers, he started his own company. Today, the small but busy company makes rowboats in three sizes as well as an elaborate duck boat complete with all-around deck and splash boards

la-Itive, 115 km east of Quebec City on the north shore of the St. Lawrence

River, opposite picturesque

Isle aux Coudres. In the early 1960s, the popular Canadian author Msgr. Felix-Antoine Sayard had a dream and his dream came true in 1965 when the Papeterie Samt-Gilles went into production. The small shop is the only one in North America to make parchment entirely by hand

Artist Georges Audet, now deceased, was the mill's first manager He spent some time in Auvergne, France, studying the art of making parchment and he instructed his successor, Marcel Langeher

Langelier and his three employees make a deluxe chine paper that compares favorably with similar papers from Japan, China or France. Incorporated into the pulp are bits of birch silk. local flowers, leaves and

The little mill produces about 50,000 sheets of paper a year in three sizes. The four workers fashion the sheets by hand, using discolored cotton. They remove all water under pressure and dry the sheets on "clotheslines."

Most of the production is sold to tourists, right at the mill, while a few area boutiques also carry it, and a small percentage of the production is sold to specially printers who turn it into a prestige product.

DUCKSBY

THE THOUSANDS The next time you dine out in Canada and order roast duckling, glazed duck or canard a l'orange, chances are good the bird comes from Brome Lake, in Quebec's Eastern Townships.

Brome Lake Ducks Ltd. sells 600,000 ducks a year across Canada and, at all times, there are at least 10,000 white Pekins at the famous duck breeding centre. There are only three such duck farms in Canada and the Brome Lake farm, founded in 1914, is the oldest and largest.

Production increases steadily, according to General Manager Bruce McLellan whose product is sold to wholesalers and large food chains.

The farm does not accept visitors because of the danger of contamination, but the white Pekins are quite a sight from the picturesque highway around Brome Lake.






