Students' new booklet will promote Acton

With some work from senior students at Acton high school, Acton Chamber of Commerce should have an updated, more complete information booklet to offer new or prospective residents.

The new booklet, expected to be ready for distribution by June, will list businesses of all types including home-oriented services such as housewives who give piano lessons or do dressmaking with no outside advertising to inform people that such a service is available.

In making a final presentation to students about the project Friday, Chamber secretary Janet Fleming said the Chamber had a booklet which it was giving out but it was so out-of-date it was now "embarrassing".

Students will make a door-to-door canvass of the town talking to merchants and industries looking for information and especially looking for a contact person from whom further information can be obtained if necessary.

In the residential area the students will be looking for home services or industries that no one knows about but which future residents might be interested in using.

Those canvassed will be under no obligation to be included in the information booklet, of course, Mrs. Fleming stressed, but it will be a source of free advertising for them and she expects most people will be prepared to be listed.

Businesses in the rural areas will be canvassed by telephone.

The project will begin after the March break and Harold Mahood, the instructor whose fourth-year geography class is undertaking the project, hopes to have the actual calling completed by the end of April.

If for any reason a resident or business is missed he asks the appropriate person to contact either himself or Mrs.

Fleming to correct the omission.

The booklet will be given to businesses and prospective residents who write the chamber seeking information about the town, or new residents. It will include listing of businesses, institutions such as churches and schools, recreational facilities, services such as doctors and lawyers, apartment building addresses and a contact person.

A summary of area government and names of people for various departments, a map and history of the town, transportation, local restaurants, and annual events such as the fall fair and Back To Acton Days are planned.

At the end of the project the students will also take an overall look at the community and determine any deficiencies they see. These will be forwarded to the Chamber.
