## Full line of women's shoes featured at Step-Rite Shoes

Step-Rite Shoes, a new women's shoe store, opens tomorrow (Thursday) on Georgetown's Main Street across from the town offices.

Florence Fleury, who will manage the store, told The Herald that the shop will carry a full line of women's comfort and fashion shoes and will try to cater to people with irregular foot sizes and different widths as well as those with normal sizes. The store will also carry lines that are not locally available.

Mrs. Fleury, who has been involved in the retail end of the shoe business for some time, said she is quite pleased with

the opportunity Step-Rite presents her as manageress.

Naturalizer, a well-known brand of ladies' comfort dress shoes, will be one of the lines carried. Mrs. Fleury claims these shoes, made in Perth, Ontario, "fit like a slipper".

"We were very fortunate to get a franchise for the line, because they aren't given to just anyone," she noted.

Shirley Ann Kitz will also be working at the store full-time, with Melita Gassner helping out part-time.

## Mediator chosen in contract talks

The Ontario Education Relations Commission has appointed Martin Teplitsky to act as a mediator in the contract dispute between the Halton board of education and its secondary school teachers.

The two sides met for seven hours last Wednesday and were able to resolve several minor issues in the dispute. They also decided to file a joint application requesting the assistance of a mediator.

The teachers rejected a final offer from the board

two weeks ago which would have given them a six per cent raise effective only on the signing of the contract. The negotiators for the teachers said this meant an effective raise of only 2.4 per cent.

Should talks break down following the rejection of the board's final offer, the teachers have the option of asking the Education Relations Commission to conduct a strike vote. There has never been a strike by teachers in Halton.



## Cars caught fire at Halton wreckers

Area 2 (Georgetown) firefighters answered several fire calls over the past week, but they all resulted in minor damage.

A pile of cars caught fire at the Halton Auto Wreckers yard last Wednesday, but the fire was contained to three cars. There was no dollar damage.

On Friday, firefighters responded to two chimney fires, neither with any damage.

The floor under a wood-burning stove caught fire in a

residence on King Street on Saturday. Damage was estimated at \$200. Fire Prevention Officer Larry Brassard emphasized that people installing wood-burning stoves should make sure the floor is well-protected, as well as putting the stove a safe distance from the wall.

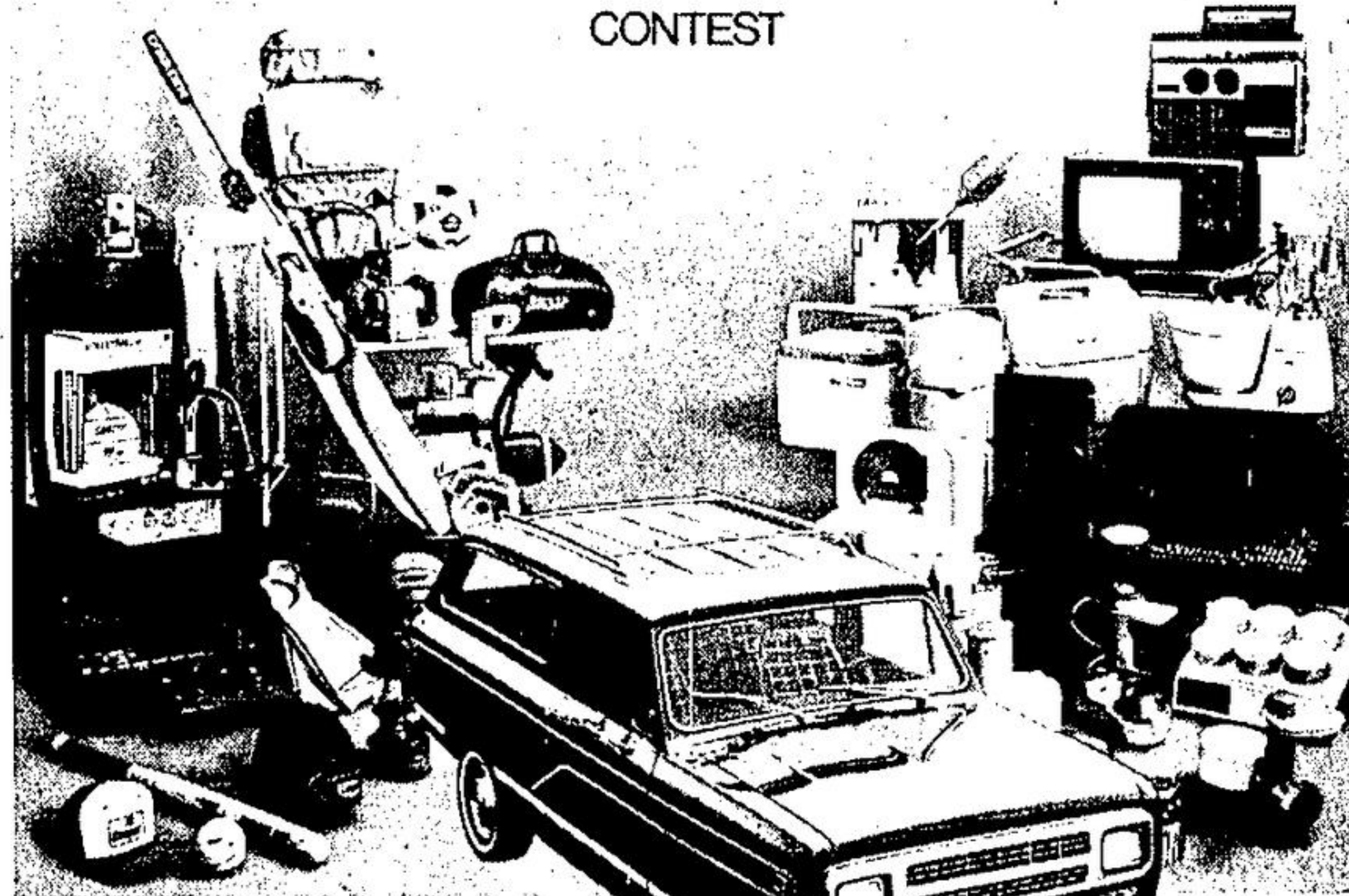
