Brampton fought back in the third to cut the margin to 4-3 before Gardner connected for his second goal of the game on a play set up by Hoddinott and Bennett. Mark Lorito rounded out the scoring as his long shot found the empty net to eliminate Brampton from play-off contention.

Georgetown will move on to the Tri-County Novice finals against the winner of Chinguacousy and Burlington semi-final.

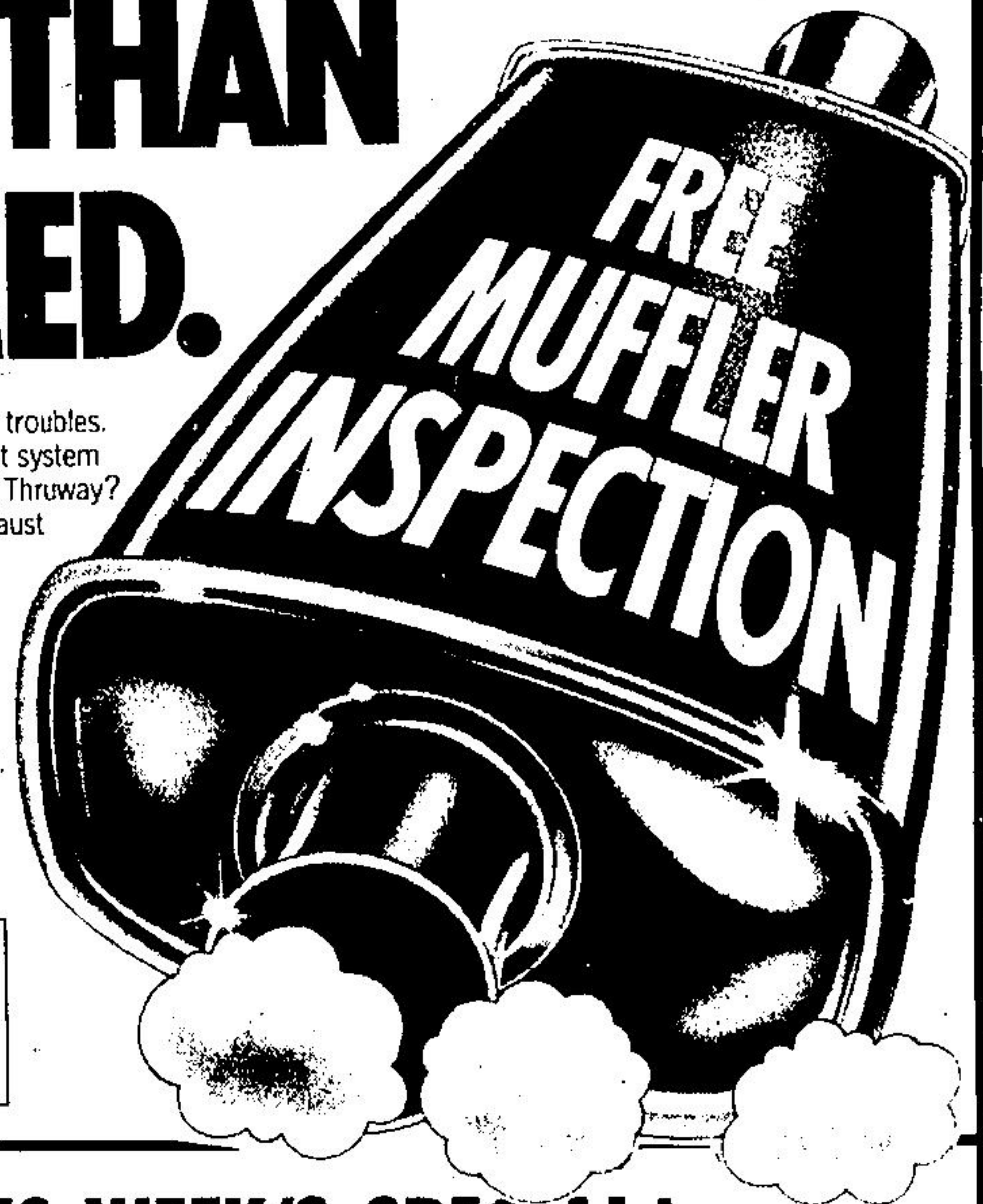
