We pay more, province

Halton taxpayers may find themselves paying a proportionally higher share of the fregion's education costs this year due to a reduction in provincial grants to the Halton board of education,

The province is increasing its grant to the board by \$1.9 million this year, but the province's proportion of the education levy will decrease. Where the province had previously paid 51 per cent of the total education bill for the pregion, this year it will drop to : 49 per cent, according to a report from the board's finance committee.

This means the province and municipal taxpayers will be paying about \$49.7 million each of the 1980 budget of \$101.7 million. The rest will come from tuition fees and other sources.

Area Superintendent of finance Barbara Moore said the average tax increase across the region from the 1980 budget would be about 4.7 mills, or \$4.67 for each \$1,000 of assessment. 27th ANNIVERSARY
