Horticulturalists meet

Gardening hints from GHS

At the February meeting of Georgetown Horticultural Society, gardeners heard a very informative lecture by Clarence Baker, an avid horticulturalist and a director of Area 15 of the Ontario Horticulture Society.

If you grow vegetables, Mr. Baker suggests that you obtain bulletin 536 from Ontario's ministry of agriculture and food, which contains information about growing vegetables and the varieties to buy to suit your garden conditions and family needs.

Plastic mulch can cut the growing time of melons, tomatoes, eggplants, and peppers by as much as three weeks. Soil temperature is raised; weeds are controlled. More information about plastic

mulch is in Bulletin 7000 from the ministry.

GARDEN HINTS

1. Plant good seed
2. Read and follow the planting and growing information in the seed catalogue
3. Garden peas should be planted by April 15
4. Plant some French Marigolds around the beans
5. Broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, lettuce, cucumber and green vegetable likes a 7-7-7 fertilizer
6. Root crops do best with a 5-10-15 fertilizer
7. Plant cauliflower early. Should be out by May 1, using a plastic mulch
8. Cucumbers like lots of heat and water. Grow them on a wire or against a wall
9. Do maggots plague the radishes? Sow a bit of epsom salts with the radish seed.

Helpful Hint: What do you do with the hyacinth bulbs you have forced when blooming stops?

1. Let the pot and bulbs dry 2. Cut off stalk to the top of the bulb
3. Take bulb out of growing medium
4. Break off the roots
5. Make two cuts at right angles across the root end about half an inch deep
6. Replant the bulb in the garden or a pot with cut marks up and two inches of soil over the bulb
7. Moisten and let grow till fall
8. Now repeat the bulb in the regular way taking care not to injure the new bulblets that have begun the grow
9. Next fall the new bulblets are ready to grow and you have extra hyacinths for your enjoyment.
