"Helpfu! Hint What do you do with the hyacinth bulbs you have forced when blooming stops".

1 Let the pot and bulbs dry 2. Cut off stalk to the top of the bulb 3 Take bulb out of growing medium, 4. Break off the roots, 5. Make two cuts at right angles across the root end about half an inch deep. 6. Replant the bulb in the garden or a pot with cut marks up and two inches of soil over the bulb. 7 Moisten and let grow till fail. 8 Now repeat the bulb in the regular way taking care not to injure the new bulblets that have begun the grow. 9. Next fall the new bulblets are ready to grow and you have extra hyacinths for your enjoyment.


