Councillors reassure Kinsmen about issues

concern about the amount of vandalism aimed at street signs in this town.
Coun. Levy agreed that it is a real problem, noting that the town has spent almost \$10,000 in the last year to replace the damaged signs.
The mayor added that broken signs are being replaced by new ones made of harder material which is "almost unbreakable".
Another problem brought up

by the Kinsmen was the fact that some of the parkettes donated by the Lion's Club and the Kinsmen are in "pretty rough shape". Club members wanted to know who is in charge of maintaining the parks.
SHORT-STAFFED
"Last year we were short-staffed and had problems keeping up with maintenance of the parks, but this year the situation should be much improved and hopefully there will

be more staff," Coun. Serjeantson explained.
She also said it is good for people to complain when they don't think the parks are being kept up properly.
"Maintenance doesn't come under the duties of the recreation department but the works department, and I can assure you they do attempt to keep up and are aware of things," Coun. Levy said. "You must realize that it is very difficult, for instance, to grow grass in areas that are constantly in use."
Another concern of the Kinsmen is the safety of children crossing Highway 7 to visit the new Halton Hills Shopping Centre. One Kinsman asked if it was possible to build a walkway over the highway.
"We have looked at that before, seven years ago, and it wasn't feasible, although I think it deserves additional attention now," Coun. Levy said.

Wood reacts to region critics

Halton Hills Coun. Ed Wood is tired of hearing Oakville and Burlington councillors constantly debate the regionalization of Halton's sewer services and its resulting benefit to Halton Hills and Milton.

The question of regional responsibility came up last week when discussion took place on a grant for the Royal Botanical Gardens, which is located in Burlington.
Burlington Coun. Joan Allingham, upset by some councillors who did not agree the RBG should be totally funded by the region, said that she "saw everybody from the region saying 'great' that sewers were going regional, but now that Burlington wants something, everybody's opposed."
Council voted to approve a \$125,000 regional grant to the RBG.

Region notice is delayed

Halton Region is circulating a notice advising taxpayers how to save some money on their 1979 income tax return, but for those who have already filed their returns it comes too late.
The region sent out notices

with the February and March utility bills to inform taxpayers that a percentage of their sewer charges can be included as property tax in the calculation of the Ontario Tax Credit. This is designed to help offset the sewer surcharge caused by the expansion of the Georgetown Sewage Treatment plant.
The region did the calculations for the amount to be included in the property tax and sent them off to the province for approval, regional treasurer Don Farmer said. But the province misunderstood the figures, and

it took a certain period of correspondence to straighten the matter out. This resulted in a delay in the issuing of the notices, he said.
For those who have not yet filed their 1979 income tax return, Mr. Farmer said they should take their sewer charges for 1979 and multiply them by 8.51 per cent to arrive at the amount to be included in the property tax. Homeowners who don't have the records of their payments should simply add \$3 to their property tax, he said.
