

Intermediate season ends with win and loss

The Raiders finished their regular season play with six periods of good hockey says coach Steve Blundy.

The 6-5 win over second place Collingwood was a big boost Friday night in the Shipbuilders' own arena. The game made a difference in the top two standings as the game could have meant a first place finish for the Shipbuilders. As it turned out Dundas won the league title the next night with a win over Georgetown.

Juri Kudrasovs led the Raiders with three goals while Gary Ford notched a pair and Colln Gordon had a single for the win.

Saturday night's 7-3 losing effort to the Dundas Merchants was due to a lack of Georgetown players on the bench. Only nine players dressed for the game including goaltender Peter McDuffe. That meant only three men on the bench to spare off shifts with.

Despite this the Raiders looked not too bad. Coach Blundy observed after the game that "if we had had two more players," they could have beat the Merchants. Unfortunately they didn't because of what the coach says were a couple of injuries and some tight working schedules and the snow storm, through which Dundas brought 18 players.

Playoff ticket prices may go up

Admission fees for the first two rounds of Raider playoff action, if they get that far, will remain constant the hockey club says. The increase will come if a third round is played.

Although the team is in desperate need of capital, the charge at the gate will remain at \$2.50 for adults, \$1.50 for students, \$1 for children and \$6.50 for a family, as it has been all season.

If a price hike does take place the range will be \$3.

\$2, \$1.50 and \$8 across the board.

These increases are necessary because the Ontario Hockey Association, under whose jurisdiction this league operates, take seven and a half per cent of the gate receipts for the first two rounds, then 15 per cent for further play. All for administration, of course.
