# Industrial hockey Norval and Glen Warriors on way to final

Things must be heating up in the industrial league playoffs judging by the number of fans who showed up on the weekend. Close to 200 fans were present to watch the controversial Norval vs Akers-Clark matchup and the competitive Glen Warriors vs Philp Publishing game.

Norval coach Norm Lockhurst, told The Herald that the Orangeville tournament they won, gave his players a boost psychologically and

helped their timing.

"But don't count Akers-Clark out," he said, "last year we were up two games to nothing in the finals and were beaten, three games to two by Philp Publishing, and Akers have a pretty good team. I'm never too optimistic but they might have thrown their best at us and still lost 6-0."

Norval scored twice in the opening period with Brad Butterworth and Charlie Knoepfli notching the markers. Dave Holmes, Ray Inglis and Brian Beaumont added the assists.

Knoepfli scored again late in the second period on a relay from Beaumont and Butterworth to give Norval a 3-0 lead.

Any chances Akers-Clark thought they had to get back in the game went out the window as Inglis scored 45 seconds into the final frame. The assists went to Ian Syme and the fleet Knoepfli.

John Thompson finished up the scoring for Norval with two goals in the last quarter of the period on assists from Butterworth, Syme and Dave Holmes.

The competition was much

tougher for the Glen Warriors in their game with Philp Publishing.

Although the Warriors struck for two goals by Don Richards and Doug Pemberton in the opening period, Philp Publishing stormed back to even the score with markers by Kevin Brown and Warren Day. Paul Gingras closed out the period with a goal for the Warriors to give them a shaky 3-2 lead to take to the dressing room.
