Rotary hosts Industry 80

The Georgetown Rotary Club is sponsoring the town's first trade show, Industry 80.

"The show will hopefully become an annual event that will promote the service, manufacturing and trade-type industries in Halton Hills and environs," Rex Heslop, spokesman for the Rotary, told The Herald.

The proceeds from the show will be used by the Rotary in their ongoing community projects.

The show will take place on May 15, 16 and 17 at the Alcott Arena and will have booths for 96 exhibitors. The booths will be sold for \$130 a piece and professional display people (PANEX) will be on hand to help those who wish assistance in setting up their booths. There will be a charge for their services.

Mr. Heslop stated that he would like to see small local industries and manufacturers apply for the booths first, and then sell the remaining space to larger industries. He feels this gives the smaller businesses more exposure and

may eventually lead to them supplying larger companies with needed materials.

The first half of the exhibition will be open to trade people only, while the public will be able to see the show on Friday and Saturday. There will be an admission charge of \$1 for adults.

Mr. Heslop said that the exhibition will be a "major undertaking" for the Rotary but is very confident the show will be a success.

"We've been working on this since last year and now everything is starting to come together. The show will allow industries to increase their markets and trade opportunities so we feel that many area people will be interested in exhibiting as well as attending," he said.

The Rotary Club, which will be assisted by the Acton and Milton Rotary Clubs, hopes to have local dignitaries as well as provincial representatives present at a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the show's opening.

Students conduct energy survey

Students from Acton High School will be conducting a telephone survey of households in the Acton area for the University of Guelph's Rural Development Outreach Program next week.

The study, which will ask questions about energy use and adjustments made by families, is a joint effort by the Energy Task Group and the University of Guelph. The questionnaire is now available, and copies are available from various locations in Acton, including the Acton High School and the library.

The high school students will be calling 300 additional families. The committee is hoping to get broad representation of family types, living in different kinds of accommodation, driving various makes and sizes of cars, trucks and vans in order to make comparisons. The questionnaire is designed to find out how much energy the family uses over the period of a year for home heating,

electricity and transportation; the number of people per family commuting to work, to school and to community functions; housing arrangements, consumption patterns, knowledge and attitudes about energy issues and energy conservation.

The survey should be returned by April 10, either by mail or delivered by hand, to the high school so that the university can begin to analyze the data for a preliminary report to be released in June.

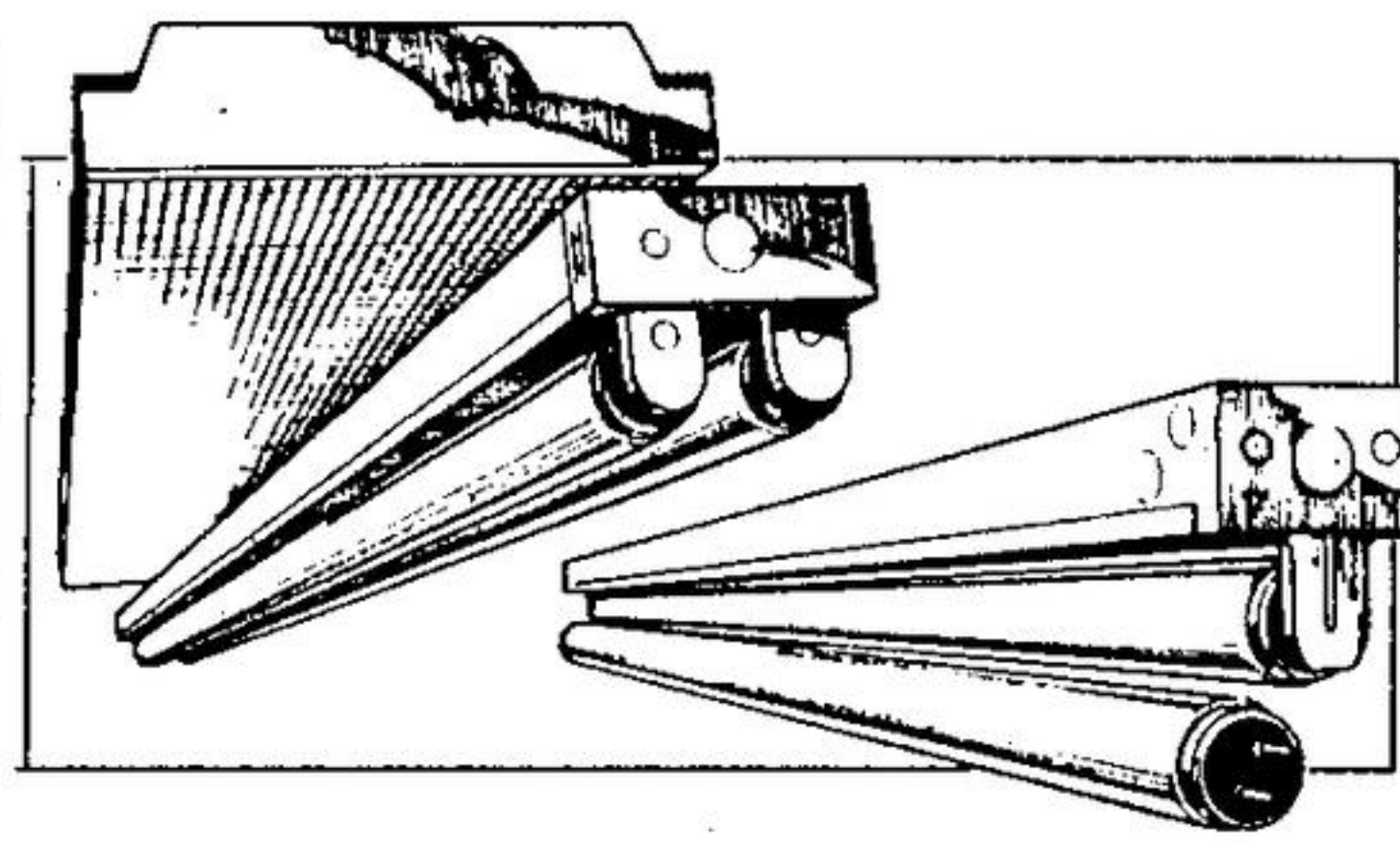

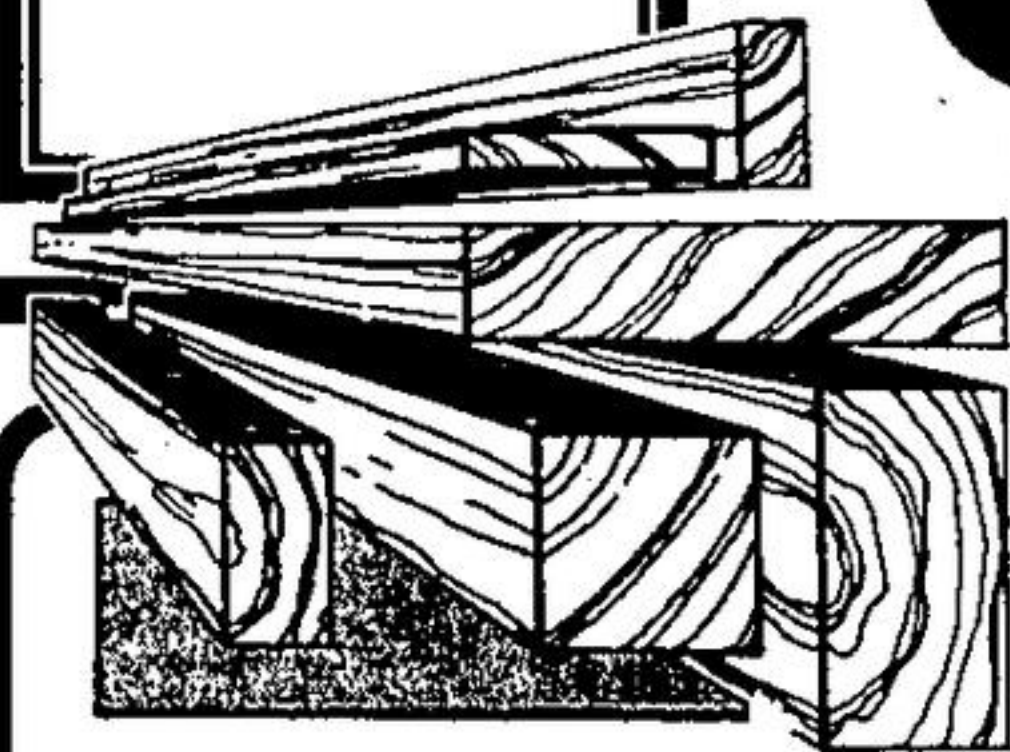

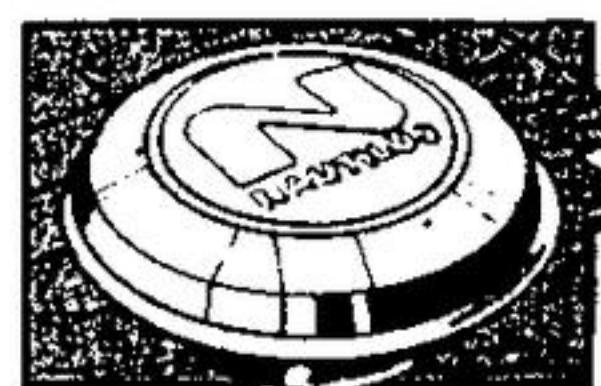
