Operators support plan for licencing of area rest homes

A recent suggestion that Halton Hills licence rest homes has drawn enthusiastic response from three of the four area rest home operators. The owner-operators feel licencing would be a stamp of municipal approval of their businesses that can't do them any harm.

It would be reassuring to prospective clients and their families to know that a home they were investigating prior to entry is inspected and meets area regulations, the operators believe. It was also suggested that having to meet regular inspections could act as protection for the operators in certain situations.

Janet Booth, who has operated Acton Seniors Residence for just over three years, insists the people she hires to care for the seven people who live in her home must have previous experience with elderly people. A registered nurse with geriatric experience, she stresses that without experience, it can be difficult to communicate with residents.

Although health and fire inspectors visit her home regularly she would like to see the rules tightened in some areas. "People who have had strokes or slight memory loss can't protect themselves," she says, "so you have to do it for them."

Jeannette Fernandes has operated Jeannettes Home for Senior Citizens Ltd. for three years. Among her 39 residents are some supported by regional government agreements and must meet guidelines set down by Halton region in December.

"I'd back it 100 per cent," she said. "We need something to guide us. I didn't ask my staff to have TB tests but I have to now to meet regional guidelines. It's a good idea and I agree with the things they want us to do. We have double the number of people in rest homes that we have in nursing homes, but we have no regulations on rest homes."

Mrs. Fernandes is inspected by health and fire inspectors as are other area homes. But in addition she has social workers visiting her regularly because she is licenced as a home for special care through the ministry of health.

Joan Waldie, a trained practical nurse, has been operating Mapleview Lodge on the Halton-Wellington town line for 12 years. She has 12 residents.

Because she is on the Wellington side of the road Halton Hills licencing regulations will not affect her, but she agrees with the idea.

"It would be a feather in your cap if you could say you're licenced, or registered, or whatever," she says. "When you have older people around you're responsible for giving them ultimate protection."

"If you had a licence it would be good for the peace of mind of the families of your residents to know you were being inspected. After all, peoples' lives and happiness are at stake when they enter a rest home."

Travina Cherwonik of Cher's Rest Home would not comment on how a licencing requirement might effect her business.

Mrs. Fernandes said the suggestion to require registration or licencing for rest homes comes as no surprise to her since the region has instituted standards with rest homes since the region and health ministry began calling for similar moves last fall.

Even the Ontario Association of Homes for the Aged is pushing to see private homes meet standards of some type.

Nicholas Manherz, executive director of the association, is worried that adequate care is not provided for seniors in private homes, including boarding houses, rest homes and lodges for the elderly.

Commenting on a recent report by the association he said private homes are not governed by either the Charitable Institutions Act or the Homes for the Aged Act which sets standards for both types of institutions.

Nor does the Nursing Homes Act administered by the ministry of health apply to these homes, he said. As private enterprises they are required only to meet fire regulations and public health regulations on sanitation and food.

Police to resume negotiation

Representatives from the Halton Regional Police Association and the police commission will be meeting March 25 with a provincially-appointed conciliator to resume negotiations for the 1980 contract.

The talks came to an impasse last month, and with the agreement of the commission, the association applied to have a conciliator assist with negotiations. Victor Scott has been appointed as conciliator and the two sides will meet March 25.

Georgetown, Acton may be in same book

Customers who wish they didn't need two telephone directories to reach their wish granted next year.

Guelph area manager Bill Salmon says Bell Canada is surveying its Acton area customers to determine whether they would prefer to remain in the Guelph area directory or be moved into the Halton-Peel directory when it is distributed next year.

Bell did a survey in 1974 as a result of pressure from Halton Hills council but the response was "fuzzy", Mr. Salmon said. At that time only a population sample was surveyed to determine their preference and to the best of his memory slightly more businesses and less residences wanted to be listed in Halton-Peel. Nothing came of the survey.

"I suspect the ones against the move were louder if not greater in number," he said. "This time Bell contacted all its subscribers and followed up letters with a telephone call when no answer was received, he said.

A sample of customers in other Guelph exchanges were also surveyed to determine how they felt about losing Acton from their book.

If the change is made non-residents in the area might find local numbers with slightly less confusion since Acton and Georgetown would be listed separately but grouped together under the heading of Halton Hills.

The move, if it is made, would not in any way effect the toll free calling area and Acton would still call Rockwood and Guelph as well as Georgetown and Milton toll free. Oakville, Brampton, Erin and Hillsburgh would still remain long distance numbers.

If Acton doesn't change directories, Mr. Salmon reminds customers that they are entitled to a free Halton-Peel directory anyway because they can call Georgetown and Milton toll free right now.

\$15,000 in house fire

There was a house fire in Terra Cotta on Wednesday of last week that resulted in an estimated \$15,000 damage.

The clean-out area for the fireplug led into the dwelling's fruit cellar, allowing live embers to fall into the area and cause a fire. Fire Prevention Officer Larry Brassard said that the fire had taken "quite a hold" by the time the residents discovered it.
