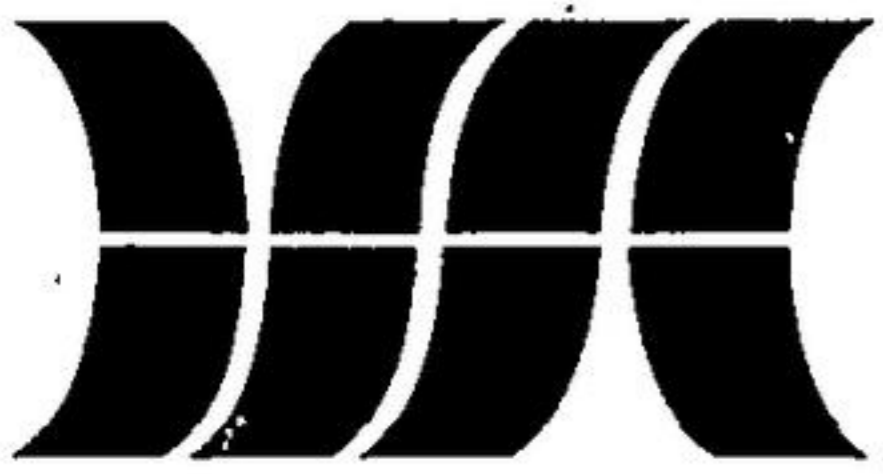

## HALTON HILLS ARTS COUNCIL Y art auction Friday

The Georgetown Y's Gala Art Auction is this Friday evening at Holy Cross Church. The auction is being sponsored by the Beaux Arts International Gallery in Toronto, and will feature works by local artists such as Shirley Deaville, and Gretchen Day. Other Canadian artists will be represented as well. International artists such as Picasso and Dalí will have prints in the auction. An admission fee of \$3.50 will be charged for the auction, which will begin at 8:30 p.m. Preview is at 7:30 p.m. with wine and cheese being served.

The St. Andrew's and St. John's United Church choirs will be performing jointly a special Palm Sunday concert March 30. The choirs, directed by Terry Champ and Dale Wood, will be performing Handel's Messiah at St. John's Church.

## Crazy Boat Race defies the weather

There is no turning back for the Jaycees Georgetown and their plans for the thirteenth annual Crazy Boat Race down the Credit River Saturday.

Either it runs as scheduled, or it is cancelled completely says race organizer Ernie Stoakley.

Only a terrific snow storm Saturday or such heavy rain that the river rises dangerously high by race time will cause the cancellation, he said.

"All we need is a 20-foot wide path cleared of ice so we can get the boats out of the river in an orderly fashion," he said. "One of the members is seeing (town engineer) Bob Austin today (Tuesday) to see about getting a dozer or a front-end loader in to drop some of that ice back into the river and clear a road for us. If that can't be arranged we'll set up a work party ourselves and do it."

Mr. Stoakley said there was almost that much ice in the river a week before the race last year but by race time everything was fine. Organizers are hoping for a repeat of last year's conditions.

Even if the race has to be cancelled, the dance in the Acton Legion auditorium Saturday evening will go ahead, he said.

Registration will be held between 10 a.m. and 12:15. Class A registration for two-man canoes will be held in Cheltenham while registration for the rest of the classes will be held at the Terra Cotta Inn.

The canoe class will get underway at 12 p.m. in Cheltenham, while the other classes will start between 12:30 and 1:30 p.m. in Terra Cotta. All participants must wear approved life jackets, and protective head gear and wet suits are recommended.

There is no limit on the number of participants on a particular craft, except in the two-man canoe class. The boats must all be manually powered.

Tickets are still available for the victory dance at the Acton Legion. McMillan and Wife will be the disc jockeys for the dance, which will include five spot dances and two door prizes. Tickets are available by contacting Ted Daquano or Akers and Clark Real Estate.

The Jaycees are hoping for a record crowd of spectators this year to watch the participants sink or float. Last year, the group estimates there were about 3,000 to 4,000 people on hand to view the spectacle.

## Computer consulting service offered

A Word Processing Service is now being offered by M.A. Lamothe and Associates Inc. of Georgetown in addition to a consulting service offered to the electrical industry.

The Word Processing Service includes mailing lists, personalized form letters, reports, price-parts lists and catalogues. The system is computerized and allows for speedy updating and editing of mailing lists. Names on the mailing list can be printed on to address labels or envelopes.

Marg Lamothe said "personalized form letters can be created from the lists and this allows companies to send letters to a specific person. People are more likely to read a letter addressed to them personally."

Anyone who has ever done a catalogue knows how difficult to keep it up to date. With this new service any necessary changes can be made without having to re-type the entire catalogue by using a computer.

The computer used by Lamothe and Associates stores information on floppy discs that can hold up to half a million letters.

The computer also runs a high-quality typewriter.

Mr. Lamothe, who used to work for Smith and Stone, incorporated his company as a consulting business last year. He now assists companies who want CSA approval on new products. The computer is also designed to issue reports and standards up-dates for the consulting portion of the business.
