Local police will investigate Milton stag

Halton Region Crown Attorney James Treleaven has decided to announce an investigation into allegations that prostitutes were hired for a stag to raise money for a minor hockey team in Milton.

The allegations stem from a front-page story in a Milton weekly newspaper that alleges acts of prostitution took place at a stag organized by the parents of some members of the Milton Minor Hockey Association. The stag was held to raise money for some of the parents to attend a hockey tournament in Rhode Island.

The announcement of the investigation follows a stormy meeting of Halton Regional

Police Commission last Thursday when members of the commission denounced the story, Milton Mayor Don Gordon, a regional representative on the commission, said the weekly "printed lies" and dealt with "rumors, innuendoes and characters assasina-

Police Chief James Harding accused the newspaper of "irresponsible journalism", and said the police department had received no complaints about the stag.

"If someone feels something has gone awry in Milton, they can make a complaint and It will be investigated," Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett, chairman of the commission, said.
