

Erin grant, \$1,475

Herald Special
Erin township council has promised normal support to members of the Ballinacree community hall board in the shape of backing for a loan to cover cost of hall renovations. Coun. Jo Schneider told council the ministry of culture and recreation has given approval for a grant request from the board to cover part of the cost of improvements to the hall.

A grant of \$1,475 will be forthcoming to cover one-quarter of the cost of renovating, insulating, adding fire retardant wall panelling and installing an industrial type exhaust fan.

The problem lies in just how soon the money will arrive. It may be in the 1980 budget. Then again it may not arrive until 1981, Mrs. Schneider was told.

Renovations, done by Hank Burnett, have just been completed recently and cost a total of \$5,900.

Halton Hills council has already granted the board an eighth of the cost of the renovations up to a limit of \$1,000 and Erin township council is backing a temporary bank loan to cover the deficit until the ministry grant arrives. They are not, however, offering the board any money towards the project.

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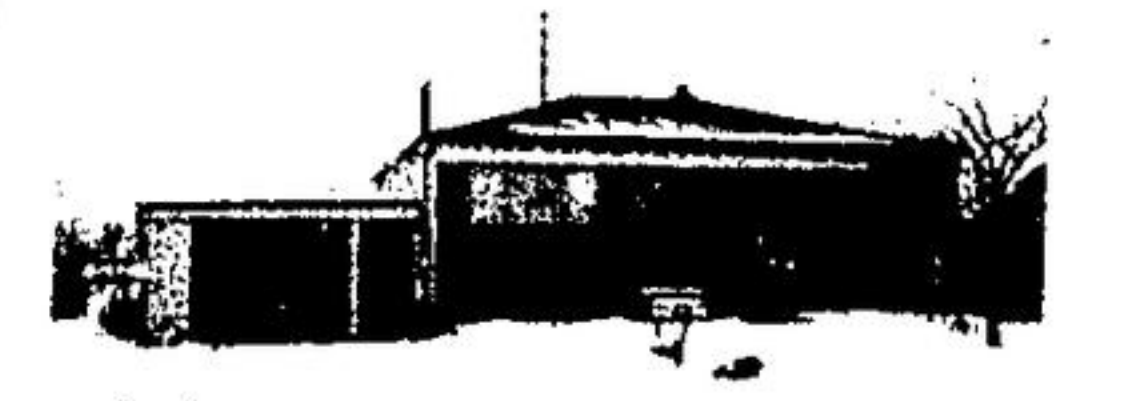

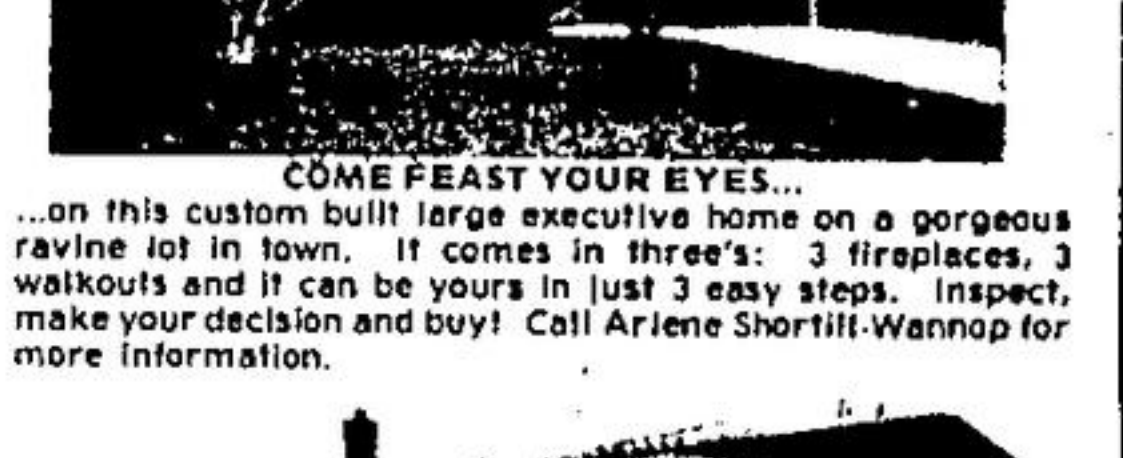

THE HALTON ROMAN CATHOLIC SEPARATE SCHOOL BOARD
TAKE NOTICE THAT
The Halton Roman Catholic Separate School Board on the 12th day of February, 1980, passed a by-law Number 33, to authorize the borrowing of money by the issue and sale of Debenture of the said Board in the principal amount of \$1,106,000.00.

1. The purpose for which the money is to be borrowed is the sum of \$1,008,000.00 for school construction and the sum of \$98,000.00 for the purchase of furniture and equipment.

2. The amount to be borrowed is \$1,008,000.00 for 20 years and \$98,000.00 for 10 years on the security of the said Debenture, which shall be a charge upon the school-house property and premises and any other real or personal property vested in the said Board and upon the separate school rates collectible by the said Board.

3. The Debenture is to be dated March 1, 1980 and is to bear interest at the rate of 11 1/2 per cent per annum payable semi-annually on March 1, and September 1, in each year of the currency of the Debenture.

The amount payable annually for principal and interest shall be in approximately equal amounts of about \$148,000.00 per year for the first 10 years and \$128,400.00 per year for the next 10 years.
