# Council rejects proposed development of 213 housing units in Stewarttown

Halton Hills council is rejecting a proposed 213-single-family lot development in the Stewarttown area, but the developer says the file should not be closed yet on his proposal.

Council passed a recommendation Monday that the 137-acre development proposed by A. Tolomei Holdings Ltd. should be rejected because it does not comply with either the Esqueing Official Plan nor the Stewarttown Secondary Plan and lacks adequate servicing systems and capacities.

The proposal was given swift and unanimous rejection when it was initially presented at last week's planning board

meeting. A representative for the developer, Doug Yarker, who was present at last week's meeting said he did not "feel the file should be closed yet" on the proposal.

Mr. Yarker said he was aware that the town and Halton region are in the process of initiating a study that will address the servicing capacity in the area.

"I request that we be consulted on the study," he said. "We want to have some input into the study."

The town and the region recently approved a study which will determine the existing sewage capacity in the Georgetown and Acton urban areas.

### TANK SPRANG A LEAK

Town council is requesting the engineer's department look into whether a pedestrian sidewalk is needed over Guelph Street in Georgetown to service the senior citizens building near Durham Street. The recommendation was introduced Monday by Coun. John McDonald, who said he had had numerous requests from senior citizens regarding the installation of some type of crossing facility.

### THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF an application by Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of Government Services (expropriating authority) for approval to expropriate land being part of Lot 15, in Concession 4, New Survey, in the Town of Milton and part of Lot 15, in Concession 5, New Survey, in the Town of Halton Hills, both in the Regional Municipality of Halton in the Province of Ontario for the purpose of acquiring land for the James Snow Parkway.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

- (a) In the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

#### NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that,
  - (a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Attorney General;
  - (b) the inquiry officer,
    - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
    - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.
2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:  
"Owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;  
"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.
3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
