#### -About the Hills—— Police contract talks breakdown

An arbitrator has still not been appointed yet to settle the contract dispute between Halton's 263-man police force and the Halton Police Commission, according to the president of the Halton Police Association.

"No one has been appointed yet," Constable Bill Gall told The Herald Monday, "We still have to wait for the report from the concilliator, which we are expecting any day now."

Talks between the association and commission broke down last week after a 10-hour conciliation meeting on Tuesday failed to bring any agree-

Halton's uniformed officers and 84 civilian personnel have been without a contract since December 31, 1979.

Last year's contract settlement made the Halton force one of the highest paid in the province, with a first-class constable earning \$21,714.

According to Constable Gall. this is only the second time the police association and the commission have been unable to reach agreement through negotiations.

The last dispute to go to arbitration occured in 1974, when the region and its police force were first formed.

#### McClure on Iran

Former United Church moderator Dr. Robert Mc-Clure was quoted in the Toronto Sun Sunday recommending that the United States round up all illegal Iranian immigrants and put them in detention centres staffed by relatives of the American hostages in Iran. Dr. McClure, who recently addressed a meeting in Georgetown, said the Iranians are not afraid to die for their cause so the only method which might help ensure the return of the hostages is bargaining with them. Dr. McClure was a field director for the Red Cross in central China during the Sino-Japanese conflict, and he also worked at the mission hospital in Ratlam in central Indian before becoming moderator of the United Church in 1968.


