Not ready to reveal plans

Town hall group is alive and kicking

Although they are not yet prepared to reveal the exact nature of their plans, members of the committee trying to raise funds for Acton's old town hall say they have a proposal in hand and are "alive and kicking".

June 13 has been chosen as the date on which they will unveil plans for the press, and the public will find out details June 18.

In the interim, Pat Wood will be responsible for mounting displays in the window of the vacant store which used to be the A and B Supermarket on Main Street.

A committee of Acton residents has been trying to raise funds to restore the old, red brick building on the corner of Bower and Willow Streets for more than two years. Deadlines have been extended twice by Halton Hills council which initially intended to tear down the two-story structure to provide increased parking space for Area One firefighters.

Committee member Ted Tyler says the June 13 date for announcing the scheme was chosen to give members plenty of time to get all the details in place. If they have things ready sooner, than that date the announcement can be made earlier.

M-S vice leaving

Acton's McKenzie-Smith Middle School will lose its vice-principal in June.

Carl Hymers, who served as vice-principal there since 1978 and spent three years before that as vice-principal at Georgetown's Centennial Middle School, was elevated to a principal's position by the Halton Board of Education Thursday night.

He will go to Linwood Public School in Oakville.

Also stepping up to a principal's post next year will be Win Procyshen. Mrs. Procyshen is a resource special education teacher at Nelson High School but spent part of 1978 as vice-principal of Stewarttown Senior School and was vice-principal at Georgetown's George Kennedy Public School from 1975 to 1978.

She will take on her new role at Pauline Johnson Public School in Burlington in September.
