Ron Hill GLT replacement

With the Georgetown Little Theatre's (GLT's) final presentation of the current season ready to debut Friday night at Sacre Coeur Church hall, director Bev Nicholas has been forced to turn over directing chores, as well as an acting role, to colleague Ron Hill.

The recent death of Mr. Nicholas' mother in Wales has prompted the director to return to his native country. He will return in time to complete pre-production work on Dear Liar, the drama being presented by Nornic Studio at Knox Church hall in Georgetown beginning April 30.

Mr. Hill, another experienced GLT contributor, had already begun standing in for Mr. Nicholas, both directing and acting during Relatively Speaking rehearsals, when Mr. Nicholas phoned from Wales to indicate that he would be unable to return in time.

Programmes for Relatively Speaking had already been printed and will carry Mr. Nicholas' name as director. Rehearsals are continuing on a nightly basis ready for the play's opening Friday evening. The play continues April 19, 25 and 26.

Saturday's performance has been designated as the GLT's fund-raising night for the town's new cultural complex. Mayor Pete Pomeroy will be on hand to officially launch the fund-raising campaign by personally purchasing the first commemorative seat plaque. Approximately \$200,000 must be raised among Halton Hills citizens so that the town can qualify for outside financial assistance needed to build the \$1.5 million library-theatre-art gallery facility.
