Parks open May 16

The five multi-use recreational parks operated by the Credit Conservation Authority open May 16 for camping... May 17 for summer picnicking and swimming. Terra Cotta Conservation Area will be open daily 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. from May 16, with a \$3 daily per vehicle charge, \$3 daily campsite charge and 50-cent walk-in fee. No picnic reservations will be accepted for Sundays and holidays during July and August. The park's pool is open weekends only until June 27, and daily thereafter, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Use of the pool costs 50 cents per person. Additional information about Terra Cotta and other areas can be obtained from the Authority at 451-1615.

Disaster fund

Town council has endorsed a resolution passed by the town of Dunville requesting the federal and provincial governments to establish a special reserve fund for help when disaster strikes. The resolution also calls for the governments to adopt a uniform policy to administer such a fund.

Dayfoot parking

Approval was given by town council Monday night to a recommendation that parking be prohibited on the turnout at the westerly end of Dayfoot Drive. The recommendation arose from residents complaints that people from Main Street were using the turnout for extended periods of time, and interfering with driveways.

'Respect for Law' week

Town council has approved a request from the Optimist club that the week of May 1 to May 7 be declared "Respect for Law" week. The council also approved a request from the Halton Regional Police Force that the week May 11 to the 17 be declared "Police Week".

Super Holstein

Elmoak Marquis Angel, a dairy cow owned by Georgetown's George Frazer, was recently awarded a superior production certificate by the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada. A nine-year old, Angel yielded 12,609 kilograms of milk and 489 kilograms of fat over a 305-day period with twice daily milking. That record and a 3.88 per cent butterfat content earned her a "very good" classification.

Pioneer Days

Main Street will be closed from James Street to Church Street for the purpose of Pioneer Days June 19 to 21. The street will be closed to traffic with the exception of through traffic on Mill Street.

Council had no objection Monday night to the McGibbon Hotel applying for a patio license for the event and recommended that the works department set up the necessary barricades, picnic tables and extra trash containers required for the three-day event. Any costs incurred will be at the expense of the downtown BIA. The BIA will also be responsible for the cleanup of the area after the event.

Annie Murray was in Womens Institute

Annie Murray, grandmother of 20 and great-grandmother of 22, died recently in Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. She was 85.

Mrs. Murray was born Annie Board in Peterborough, and attended school there. She was a lifetime member of the Evening Women's Institute and was active in the St. John's Church Guild in Stewarttown.

Mrs. Murray is survived by her husband, John Charles Murray and her four children, Kenneth Murray of Acton, Lorne Murray of Kenilworth, Marjorie (Mrs. Dave Barclay Jr.) of Stewarttown, and Phyllis (Mrs. Jim Stewart) of Stewarttown.

She was predeceased by her two brothers, Fred and Harry Board, both of Peterborough. The funeral service at St. John's Anglican Church in Stewarttown was conducted by Rev. David Sinclair and Canon J. Maxwell. Pallbearers were Mrs. Murray's grandson-in-laws, John Ottaway of Acton, Bill Lang of Glen Williams, John Stinson of Harrison, and Bob Cameron, Jim Rodgers and Keith Gillett, all of Stewarttown.

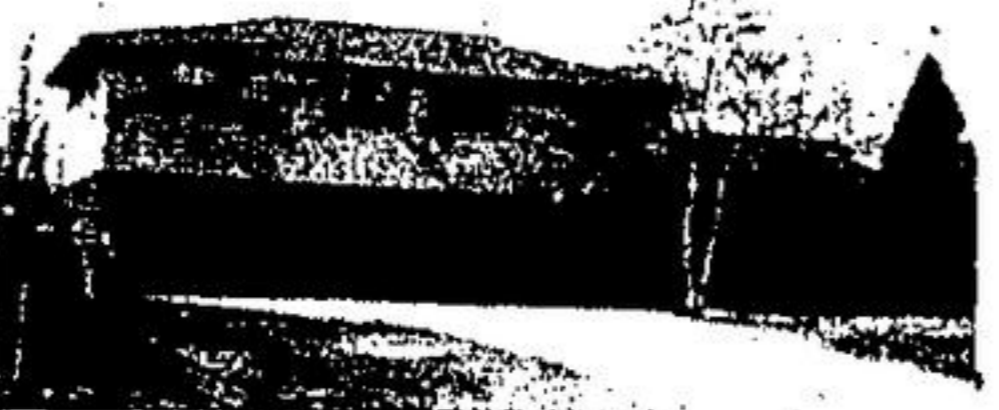

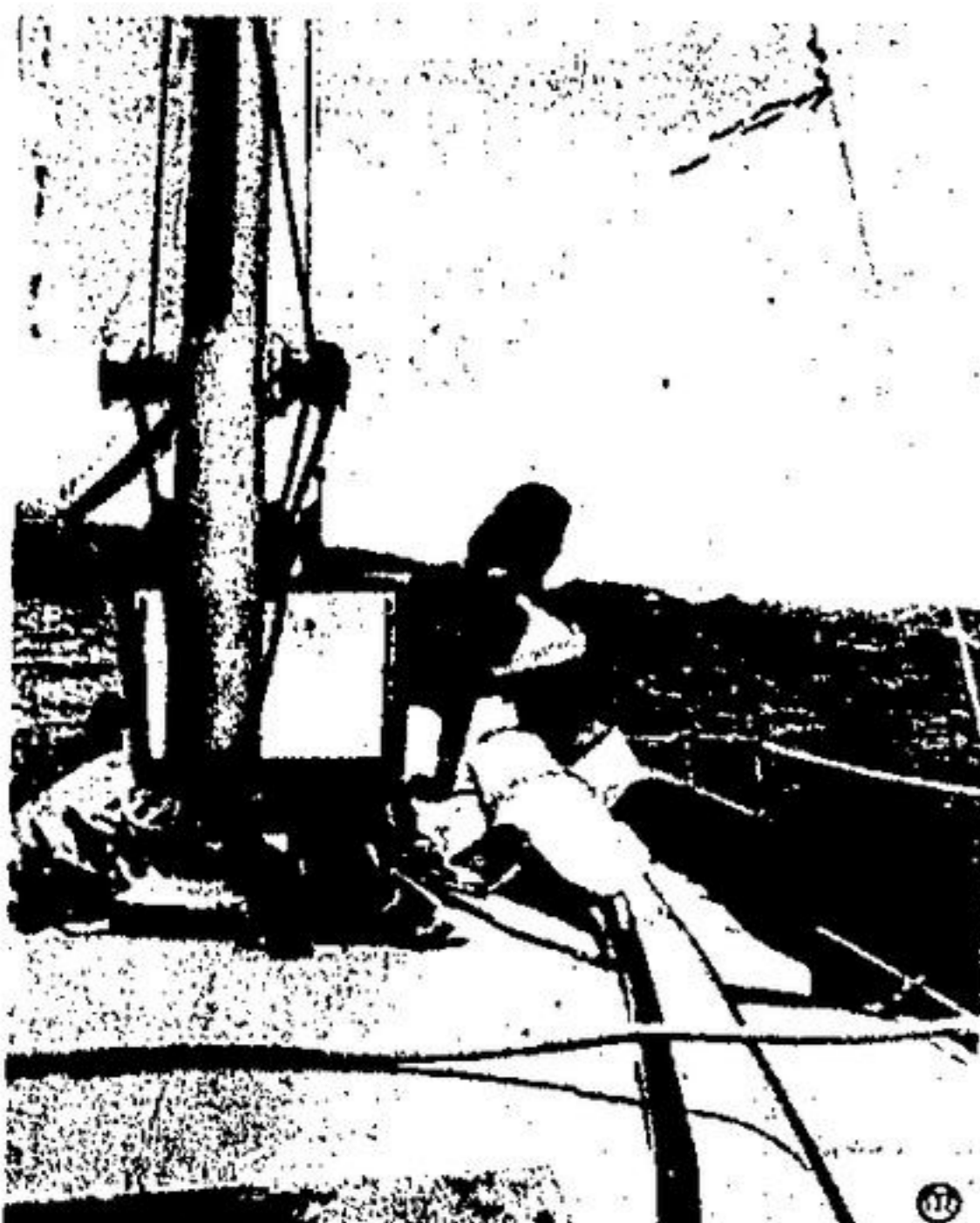

Vacation Guide

Sailing is the perfect pastime in the balmy, breezy Bahamas



WHY NOT CHARTER A YACHT to the Bahamas this summer? 700 idyllic islands make up this sun-kissed playground. With sails billowing and gentle trade winds caressing your skin, this could be your most perfect vacation ever.

to try a different, more stimulating trip than the typical beach resort vacation.

Yachts and sailing vessels of various types operate in the Caribbean as well as in the 50 miles of ocean between Florida and the Bahamas. Most maintain year-round schedules.

Schooner vacations

Though vacations to the Bahamas can also be arranged via cruise ship (Royal Caribbean Cruise Line, Costa Cruises, and GoGo Tours offer ample choices), the boom in boating vacations is best reflected in the dramatic increases of passenger volume shown by yacht and sail operators.

A leading example is Caribbean Schooner Cruises, Inc., which operates the S.Y. Lyra and S.Y. Yela, 110-foot sailing ships of Panamanian registry.

Point of departure is Prince George Wharf in Nassau, Bahamas, at 6 PM Saturday, with return a week later.

An extremely casual atmosphere prevails on the schooner, which holds 34 passengers in 17 air-conditioned cabins.

Charters, too

Though cruise ship occupants dress up for dinner, Caribbean Schooner's passengers and crews can "dress down," wearing whatever makes them comfortable.

Rates include accommodations, meals with unlimited wine, free use of water sports equipment, plus port charges and taxes.

Voyagers may become deck hands—if they wish—or may relax by swimming, snorkeling, sun-bathing, exploring various Bahamian ports of call, or enjoying beach parties, dancing and other festivities.

Caribbean Schooner Cruises also handles charters—a growing trend in both the Bahamas and the Caribbean. Charters permit passengers to see islands and ports inaccessible by land and to visit private, uncrowded coves where it is possible to enjoy total privacy while living off the sea.

Companies involved in chartering range from family teams who rent their personal yachts and act as crew to resorts that feature fleets of yachts for rent. Bareboat yacht charters are available without skipper or

crew, but crewed charters—with skipper and perhaps a cook—are also available.

Full or split provisioning can be arranged, so that the yacht is both stocked and staffed as soon as the chartering passengers arrive. Anyone interested in bareboating must document expertise in the art of sailing in advance.

Crewed charter prices include accommodations and meals, and sometimes transportation from the mainland, and also provide a "tour" without carrying luggage, changing hotels or meeting transportation schedules.

Excellent sailing

The popularity of the Bahamas as a cruising paradise is understandable. The 700-island chain offers excellent sailing waters, temperate climate, gentle breezes and a vast number of islands and coves with secluded anchorage.

In fact, more than 100,000 square miles of islands, banks and deep ocean channels on the edge of the Caribbean provide ample opportunities for boatmen to plan at the last minute.

Dock anywhere

They can dock in a hidden cove or sophisticated yacht club, depending on the mood of the moment.

Dozens of yacht resorts dot the Bahamas, and novice boatmen have few navigational difficulties once they learn to "read" the water colors: emerald green and turquoise around the banks, white water in sandy shoals, brown and orange near coral reefs, and deep indigo over the ocean depths.

There are three general areas to the Bahamas: Nassau/Paradise Island, Freeport/Lucaya on Grand Bahamas, and the Outer Islands, which cover 750 miles of warm, clear sea almost due east of Palm Beach, Florida.

Unspoiled coastline

A brochure on the Outer Islands boasts, "We have islands with neat little fishing villages that will make you think New England has tired of the winter and moved south."

Unlike Nassau and Freeport, which have abundant tourist hotels, the Outer Islands are sheltered, relaxed, and unspoiled—ideal for bareboat or crewed charter navigators. Informality is the rule.

History abounds in the Bahamas, and an important site for travelers by land or sea is Christopher Columbus' first New World landfall, in the Out Islands.

Maritime refreshment

Lighthouses, caves, cliffs, tidal holes, salt ponds, shipwrecks and islands of hidden treasure are among the multiple maritime attractions of the islands.
