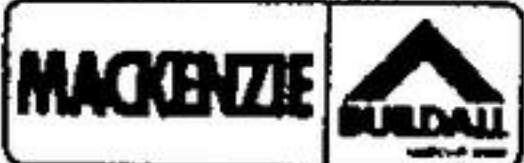

Langcraft opened in 1971 on Wesleyan Street, later to move to Main Street in 1974 where it occupied two floors servicing commercial sales on one floor and hobby interest on the second floor. Realizing some of the clientele disliked climbing extra stairs, the owners decided to move to the present location on Main Street where they can serve all customers on one level.



A family business, Langcraft is derived from the family name Langedyk and their avid interest in the arts. Crafts of many types are encouraged through the business, courses set up to comply with requests and stock kept on hand to service the requirements of the public.

Initially, the business sold yarn and model planes only and has expanded to encompass a complete line of varied crafts, yarn, extensive art supplies, and offers framing services as well.

Langcraft initiates courses in crochet, holds Christmas workshops and other workshops during the year according to public demand. The next proposed workshop will be in TOLE painting or decorative painting which is folk art. This method was seen in earlier years among the Pennsylvania Dutch, Norwegian and other European art cultures.

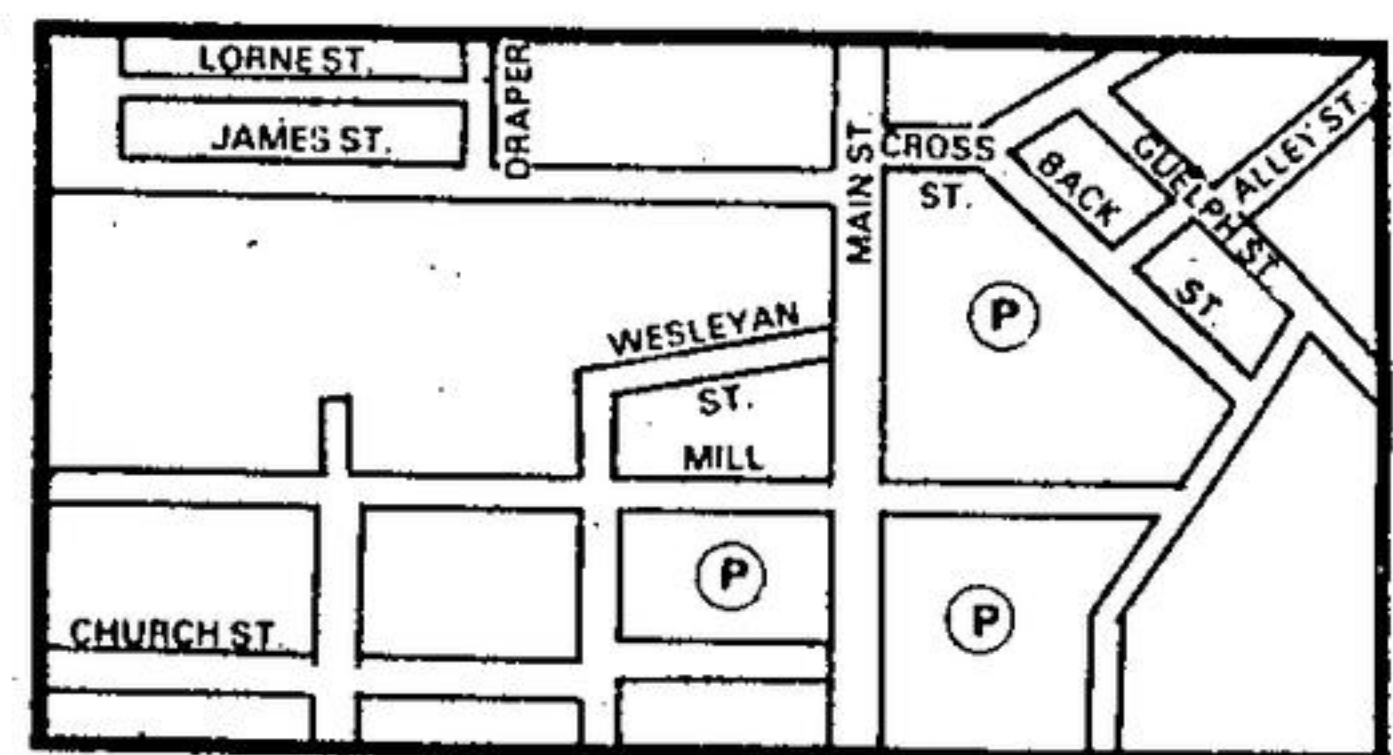


Maurice Dixon, president of this company has travelled around the world. His wife, Lula, originally of the Graham family of historical reknown in this area, assists her husband with the business.
