Reed cooler on Tory budget.

Provincial Liberal leader Stuart Smith is determined to defeat the Conservative government over its proposed budget, but Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed is more ambivalent about the merits of the budget.

"There are some things I'm encouraged about, and other things I'm discouraged about," he told The Herald this

Mr. Reed said he is particularly concerned about the effect the budget will have on pensioners in Ontario. Research conducted by the Liberals on the budget indicates that provincial grants to pensioners related to their property taxes

or rent payments are not being divided equitably, he said.

"The 85 per cent of Ontario pensioners who earn less than \$15,000 per year will receive a total of \$31 million in grants, and the nine per cent earning more than \$20,000 will also receive \$31 million in grants." he said. "They're splitting the pie in half, with one half being divided among nine per cent, and the other half being divided among 85 per cent of the

The difference between the new system and the old system is that instead of giving pensioners property tax credits, they'll receive cheques from the provinces, but the net result will be less money, Mr. Reed said.

LESS IN CHEQUE "The difference is political. because they'll get less in the cheque with the treasurer's name on it, but It'll seem like more because they're getting a cheque instead of tax credits." he said.

The provisions for energy in the budget have their positive and negative sides, Mr. Reed said. The budget eliminates taxes on alternate fuels such as propane and alcohol fuels, but there are no firms in Canada which manufacture the equipment to convert cars and other vehicles to use of alternate fuels.

"The major company in the United States that does these

conversions is in California, and it's my understanding that they're working flat out now, trying to keep up with the demand from the Americans," Mr. Reed said. "The Ontario Energy Corporation could undertake a joint venture with private enterprise to make that kind of equipment in

Canada." The budget has also dropped the sales tax on a number of energy-saving devices, but there are curlosities in deciding which items will have sales tax included and which won't, Mr. Reed said. For example, wood-burning stoves can be purchased without sales tax, but the stove pipes still have sales tax charged, he said.




