Three sections of juniors (under 16) commence perfecting their serves and backhands May 24. They too will run for six weeks, on Saturday mornings.

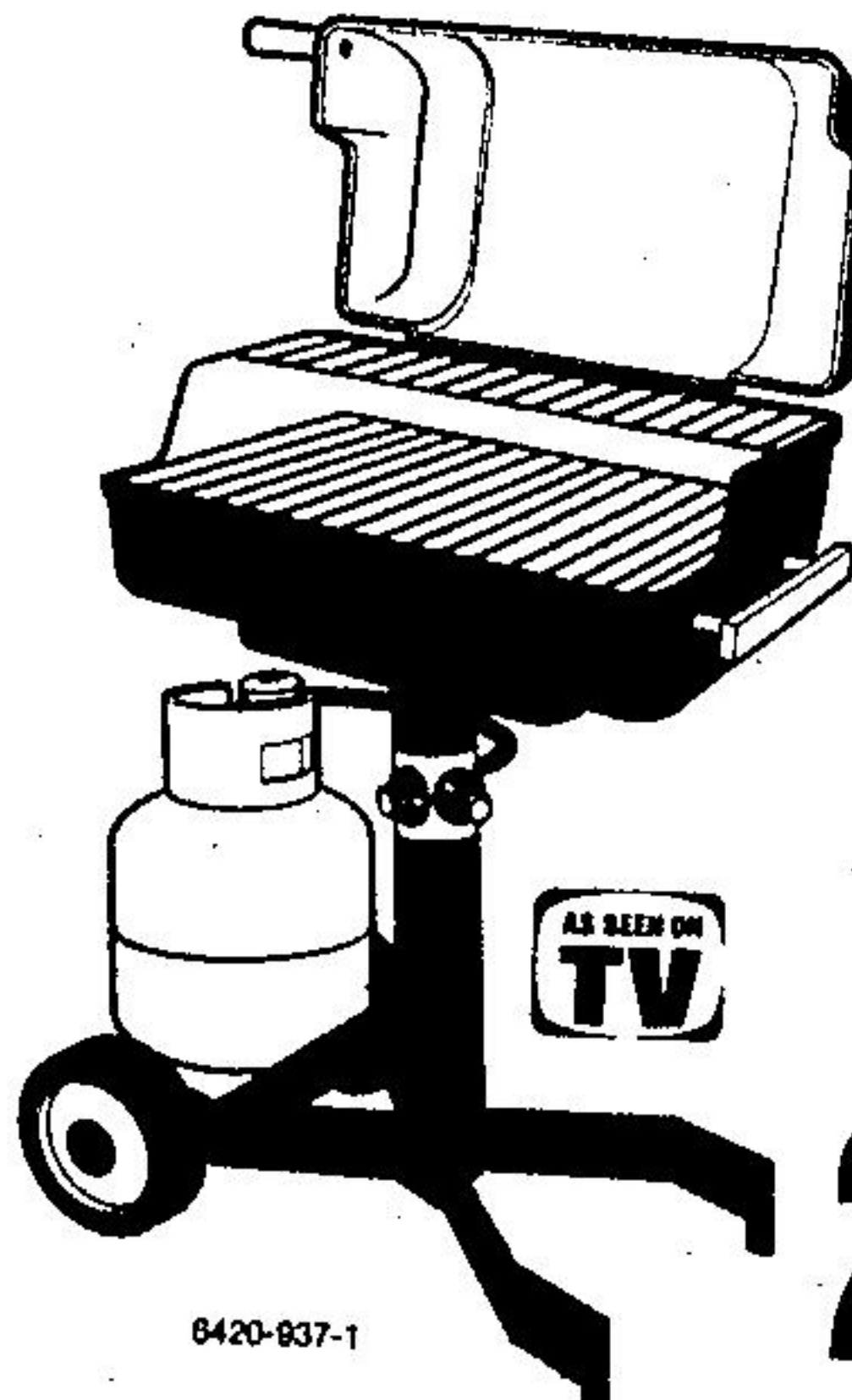
Six groups of beginner

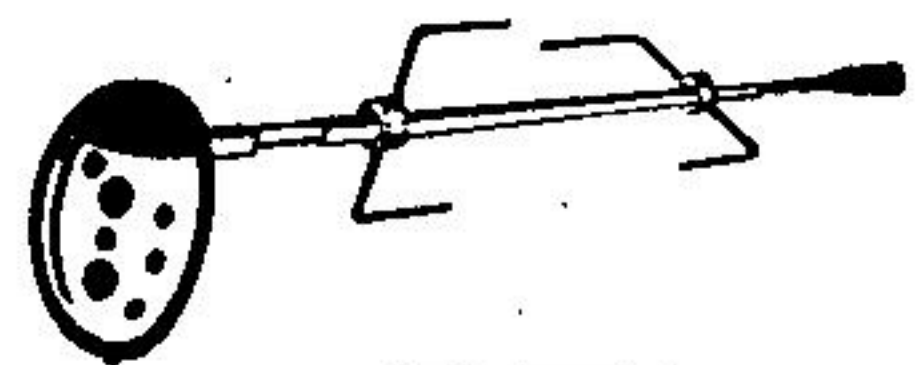
