The Braves, Georgetown's entry in the Etobicoke Summer Basketball League, remain undefeated in three outings after coasting to a convincing 69-43 victory over the Etobicoke Warriors Thursday night.

"Our strong defensive game enabled us to force the Warriors to make a lot of turnovers," coach Fred Harris told The Herald. "We went into the dressing room at half-time with a commanding 21 point lead."

The game was a much faster affair than the previous week's with fewer fouls being called on both teams. This allowed the Braves to employ a fast running game which when combined with numerous fast breaks proved too much for the Warriors.

"We don't normally like to play a run-and-gun kind of game," Harris said. "Defensive play is our specialty but, towards the end of the game things opened up a little. They scored 29 points in the second half as opposed to 14 in the first. Mind you that's not so bad, we allowed a lot more last week."

The Braves were without one of their top centres, Paul Vanoorshot, who is taking a few games off because of sore knees.

Mark Reis had a strong game for the Braves scoring 24 points and controlling the boards with his rebounding. Ted Darcie was also consid-

erent, scoring 23 points and forcing numerous turnovers. The high level of defensive play from the Georgetown team's guards, the two Foster brothers and Frost and Harris is a contributing factor in the team's continuing success.

This week the team will be without the services of Reis who will be on vacation for three weeks in Florida.

"If we come up against some tough teams the other members of the team are experienced enough to pick up the slack," Harris commented. "Guys like Teddy Darcie thrive on a lot of work anyway."
