



## Trespasser shot on farm

A Milton farmer has been released on \$100,000 bail after being charged in the shooting death of another Milton man who was fishing in the farmer's pond.

Andre Francis Wysman, 23, of Milton, died Sunday evening from a gunshot wound in the back. Mr. Wysman and two other young men were fishing in the private pond on 10 Sideroad near Highway 25, early Sunday morning when the owner of the property found them.

He allegedly fired three shots to scare the men away, and Mr. Wysman was accidentally struck in the back. Neither of the other men was hurt. Halton Regional Police say it was a .22-calibre rifle which was fired.

Mr. Wysman was taken to Milton District Memorial Hospital, where he died around 8:30 p.m. Sunday.

Robert Marshall Esplen, 49, of R.R. 3, Milton has been charged with criminal negligence causing death. He spent one night in jail before appearing in court Monday morning and being released on bail.

Mr. Esplen was ordered to appear in provincial court in Milton May 26 to set a date for his trial.

## Grim coincidence

Sunday's tragic shooting coincided in a grim but timely fashion with the release of "Ruralities", the first in a series of tabloids prepared by the local task force of the University of Guelph's Rural Development Outreach Project. The first issue features an informative look at the problem of trespassing in the rural areas, written by Halton rep Henry Stanley. Task force member Pam Sheldon of Speyside pointed out the irony of the situation Monday following the weekend shooting. "It's a horrible way to learn a lesson," she commented, expressing sorrow for the slain man who police believe was trespassing when a landowner shot at him. See inside for more on "Ruralities".

# Halton Hills students raise almost \$5,700



Kinsmen report that nearly \$5,700 was raised for Cystic Fibrosis mainly through the efforts of Acton High School students like the young man above and the two go-go dancers in the windows, below.

More than 180 Acton and Georgetown high school students "faced off" for the annual Cystic Fibrosis Bump-for-Life dance-athon Saturday, raising nearly \$5,700 for the charity, but the much-anticipated return to "competition" by GDHS let organizing Kinsmen down.

Only 18 dedicated Georgetown students picked up Acton's gauntlet, prompting the Kinsmen to cancel the bump-for-life at GDHS and transport the Georgetowners to the Acton high cafeteria for ten hours of heavy non-stop dancing with their 163 fellow students from Acton.

Kinsmen organizers estimated that pledges collect-

ed by the Acton students will raise \$4,628.10 for cystic fibrosis research and treatment, while Georgetown's participation will add another \$1,042.60.

Cindy Brouillard and Katherine O'Hara of Acton High and Kathy Kuchmas and Melitta Gassner of GDHS took top honors for gathering the most pledges.

Music for the occasion was sponsored and provided by the Sierra Band, led by Ron Hachey, Gama Sound, Armstrong Music and All Sounds Disc Jockey.
