Wintario funds for SWMC?

Halton regional council agreed last Wednesday to ask the provincial government to allocate Wintario funds for the construction of resource recovery plants in areas where existing landfill sites are nearing full capacity.

Regional chairman Jack Raftis and Halton Hills Coun. Russ Miller, who chairs Halton's solid waste management committee (SWMC), will consult federal and provincial ministries with respect to possible funding of a resource utilization plant and a market development program for the region.

Even with the proposed expansion to the Oakville and Burlington landfill sites, the region will only have landfill capacity for solid waste until 1983.

"We may get loan assistance from the provincial government," Coun. Miller told The Herald. "They may participate in our solid waste program if we show them the region is interested and serious."

"However, they're not going to waste government funds and we haven't (yet) shown we are serious about our program. You can see that by the way we cut preliminary funding for a resource utilization plant and a market development study out of the regional budget this year."

Ontario Premier Bill Davis has made it clear that energy conservation is a top priority of his government, Coun. Miller noted.

"Solid waste is a very valuable fuel and has great potential," he said. "At the present time, Wintario monies are being used for sports and recreation, which can't really be considered a top priority when some municipalities in the province are fast running out of landfill sites."

The SWMC committee also noted that the public of Ontario seriously questions the practice of landfilling solid waste because of potential environmental hazards and because, invariably, prime farm land is affected.

Dufferin violence halted by court

A permanent injunction obtained by Milton quarry firm Dufferin Aggregates will hopefully prevent intimidation and violence between the 41 truckers on strike at the quarry and independent truckers still hauling gravel out of it.

Dufferin Aggregates will also go to court to seek reimbursement for losses it claims have resulted in a picket line dispute two weeks ago.

Toronto lawyer William Phelps, acting for Dufferin, said the company will take legal action against six of the truckers.

Earlier in the week, there was a temporary injunction that restricted the number of men who could picket the quarry at any one time. That injunction is no longer in effect.

The new injunction does not restrict the number of pickets, but it does expressly prohibit violence, intimidation or obstruction.

The truckers went on strike three weeks ago to back demands for work guarantees.

Dufferin president Frank Dewitt claims the truckers are trying to gain a larger volume of work, but that, he said, is something the company can't guarantee.

Mr. Dewitt claims that the striking truckers represent only about 18 per cent of the carriers using the pit, and that 50 per cent of the business is handled by trucks sent in by customers.

The truckers have rejected several offers from the company, but Mr. Dewitt remains hopeful that everything will be ironed out in time.
