Jelinek criticizes auto deficit

Canada's ailing auto Industry needs help, says Halton MP Otto Jelinek, and he gave the Commons three suggestions last week which he thinks could help.

Temporary removal of the nine per cent federal excise tax on North American-built cars, a quota on foreign imports and a review of the "obsolete and inadequate" Canada-U.S. auto pact would help the industry, Jelinek said.

He told the Commons that Chrysler Canada Ltd., which received a \$200 million aid package from the federal government, laid off 1,200 employees days after receiving the aid.

In the first three months of this year, said Jelinek, the Canadian deficit in auto trade with the U.S. rose to a record 535.9 million.

Jelinek sought support for a motion asking that a committee of the Commons consider the auto industry's problems and his suggestions.

He was unable to get the support needed for action on his motion.
