Two anaerobic digesters used in the treatment of sewage at the water pollution control plant are in need of repairs. The plant uses three digesters normally but at the present time, only one is in operation. One digester is under going repairs worth \$14,300 while the remaining unit will undergo repairs in the near future according to Bob Moore, director of public works for the region. In 20 years of use the digesters have not needed major repairs.
