The board of trustees of the Glen Town Hall will be sponsoring festivities to commemorate Canada Day July 1. The board hopes to hold a beer garden again on the Apple Products property subject to the town's approval and LLBO permission.

Hydro rate hike?

Ontario Hydro is seeking a 9.4 per cent average increase in its 1981 bulk power rates. The increase would mean an average increase of 9.3 per cent to each of the 323 municipal utilities and an increase of 9.6 per cent to Hydro's 165 large direct industrial customers. The Ontario Energy Board will be reviewing the proposal at public hearings this summer. About 45 per cent of the total increase is due to fuel and related costs. Much of this increase will be used for additional coal-fired generation and the higher cost of coal.
