Ontario Hydro is seeking a 9.4 per cent average increase in its 198t bulk power rates. The increase would mean an average increase of 9.3 per cent to each of the 323 municipal utilities and an increase of 9,6 per cent to Hydro's 105 large direct industrial customers. The Onlario Energy Board will be reviewing the proposal at public hearings this summer. About 45 per cent of the total increase is due to fuel and related costs. Much of this increase will be used for additional coal-fired generation and the higher cost of coal.




