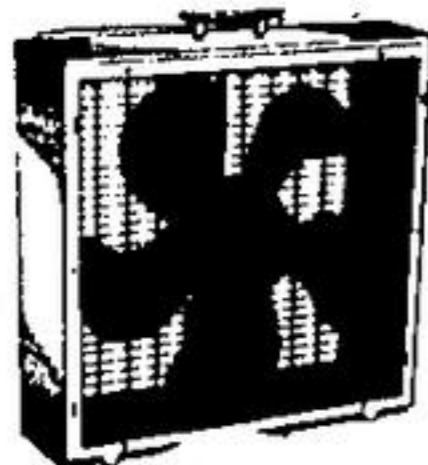
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THE FLOWER CONNECTION

In this store, you'll find handcrafted containers for arrangements and a wide selection of silk flower corsages. Silk flower custom work is also encouraged by the Trebles. Mr. Treble hand picks his plants from greenhouses in order to acquire quality plants. "Selective choice assures me of a satisfied customer," he said, "which is what we aim towards always." As president of the Horticultural Society, Mr. Treble will be active on two locations June 21 when the Horticultural Show takes place at Knox Church as well as Pioneer Days downtown.
