Val Williams was excellent in the Junior Girls high jump with a first place finish at a height of 1.60 (5 ft. 3 inches). This is a school record and personal best for Williams.

Brad Ferguson came sixth in the Junior Boys long jump. Had he jumped as far at this meet as he did at the Halton's, he would have easily qualified for regionals. His second at the Halton's at 6.16, was a personal best and shattered the four-year old school record by more than three feet.

The last event of the day was the Open Boys 4x400m relay. Georgetown's relay team, consisting of Dale McGregor, Jon Lancaster, John Warnock and Doug Smith all had run tiring races previously but managed to finish fifth with Smith again outdistancing a runner at the end.

The team was slightly out-classed and found that the other teams specialized only in the 400 m relay event. This same Georgetown team, however, was champion at the Halton's only one week before.
