Summer 'farmers' sought

Interviews are going on now for students hoping to get a summer job on a farm through the Ontario ministry of agriculture and food's junior agriculturalist program.

Sandra Harrison, OMAF representative from Ancaster, is interviewing 35 to 40 Halton teenagers looking for a place in the program.

Ms. Harrison says she will only be hiring 25 students aged 16 and 17 to work in Halton, Peel, Wellington, Dufferin, Wentworth, Brant and Niagara north and south. This is a reduction from last year when the program took in three times that number. Although she isn't sure, she suspects budget restrictions of forcing the cut back. Only 190 students will be hired throughout Ontario this year.

The students chosen come from non-farm backgrounds, she says. Many of them are unsure of the career destination at this age but they want to work on a farm and the program lets them do this. It is also useful to students who need practical farm experience in order to attend Ontario Veterinary College in the future and to students wanting to enter Ontario Agricultural College.

The students work from June 16 to Aug. 15-16. The department pays \$6 a day while the host farmer pays the other \$6 plus providing room and board for the student.

Ms. Harrison says she could use more host farmers from Halton. So far she has only one or two. The farmer must be interested in working with young people as well as capable of supervising them. Only one student is assigned to a farm. Any type of full time commercial farming operation is suitable as a host farm and both guys and girls are accepted in the program.

Students can't work in the program more than one year but after a summer of farm experience they can apply to be in Agriscrow or the Canadian farm labor pool, Ms. Harrison says.
