

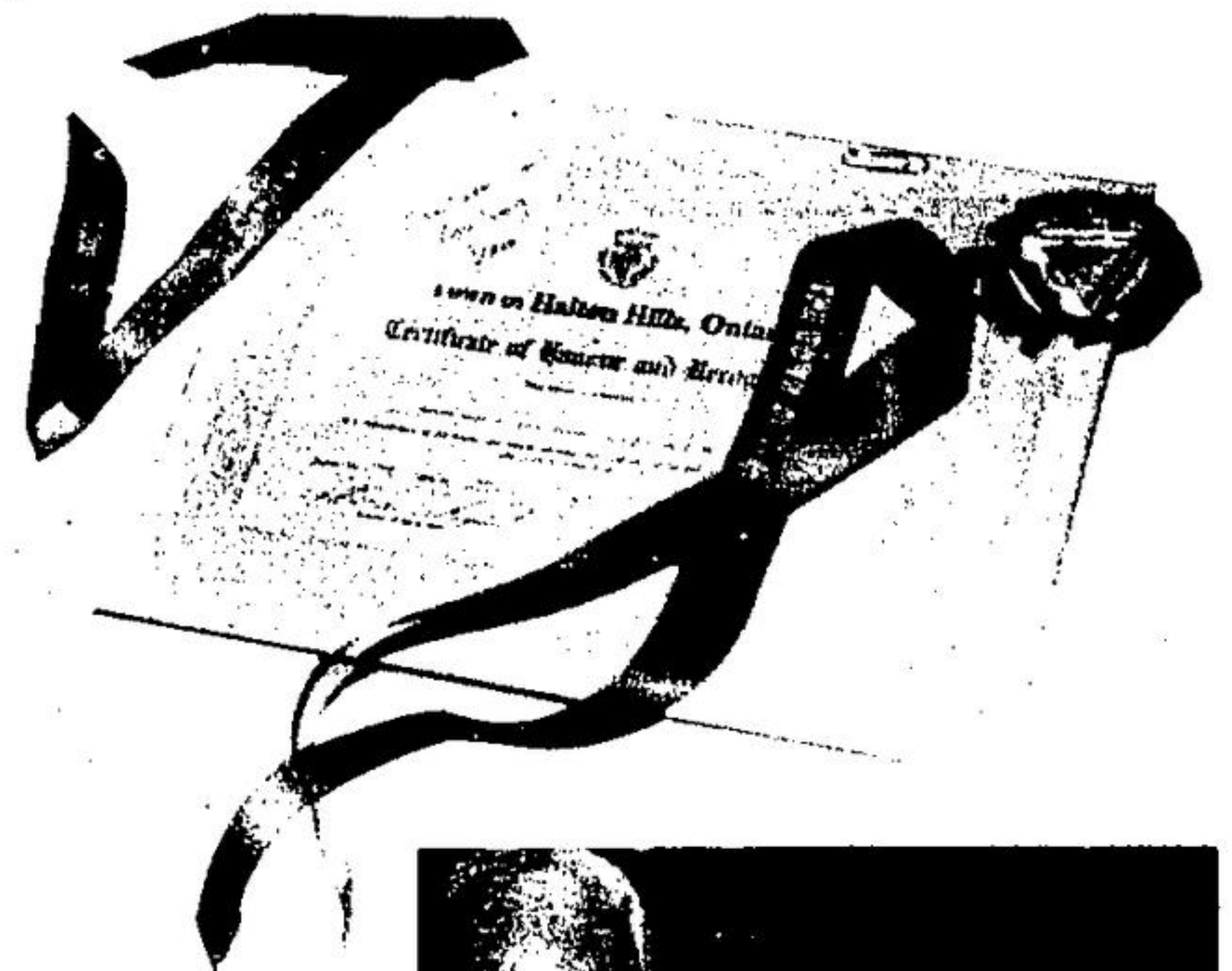
Best among all interests, ages honored
