PCs need youth view - MP

Recruiting new, younger members should be the target of Progressive Conservative party workers, who must strive to change the party's image of being old, out of touch and rural-oriented, according to Brampton-Georgetown MP John McDermid.

"We as a party must in the next few years attract the young," Mr. McDermid said at the annual meeting of the Brampton-Georgetown Federal Progressive Conservative Association last Wednesday.

"We're not a party of the old, although we're perceived as such, and it's time we changed that image," he said.

The young must see the Tories as understanding, approachable and interested, said Mr. McDermid, who noted the average age of the PCs caucus is the mid-forties with Tory leader Joe Clark only 41.

Youth is a central concern of Mr. McDermid's, who announced last week he has been appointed youth critic in

the Tories' shadow cabinet with a formal announcement expected soon. Mr. McDermid blamed the Tories' defeat in the February election on ineffective communication of its goals, such as energy self-sufficiency.

"The area of communications cannot be overlooked," he told the gathering of about 50 people. Mr. McDermid commented that the short-lived "conservative government" didn't have time to sell its budget, which sparked the downfall of the Tories in December.

While the proposed 18 cent a gallon excise tax increase stole headlines, energy credits to cushion the impact to lower income people were ignored, he said.

But Mr. McDermid predicted the Liberal government is setting Canadians up for an increase in oil prices "much greater than our government ever proposed."

Mr. McDermid said the Conservatives are still waiting for the Liberals' "infamous

made in Canada" oil prices.

Mr. McDermid accused the Liberal government of offering very few original policies,

saying it is very adept at stating nothing while gaining public support.

The Liberals are also adept at political patronage, he said,

citing the relocation of a proposed Eldorado uranium plant from a Tory riding in Port Hope to a Liberal Northern Ontario riding.

McDermid cool to BNA reform scheme

Brampton-Georgetown MP John McDermid has reacted cautiously to a suggestion by one of his constituents - a fellow Progressive Conservative - that all Canadians should be given a chance to approve or reject any proposed constitutional changes through a national referendum.

Because the House of Commons is not always responsive to public desires, any planned reform should require approval by at least 75 per cent of voters in a

nationwide referendum, according to Brampton Tory Jim Calvert.

Mr. Calvert presented a resolution to that effect at last Wednesday's annual meeting of the Brampton-Georgetown PC Association. The motion was referred to a policy committee and is not expected to come before the membership again until the association's next annual meeting.

Mr. Calvert commented that he does not support any change in the British North

America Act, despite the need for reform indicated by Quebec's 60-40 split on Premier Rene Levesque's sovereignty-association scheme.

Mr. McDermid remarked that he isn't sure a referendum is the answer, pointing out that Quebec's own referendum May 20 tore some families apart and left wounds which may take years to heal.

"I would hate to see that type of thing happen across the country," he said.

Women's hostel opening set back

Opening date for Milton's Women's Place, the Milton hostel for abused wives and their children, has been set back to September.

Peggy Balkind, spokesman for the board, said last week that a commitment from Morguard Trust has been received giving the board up to \$122,000 in mortgage money and renovation funds.

Now the board is awaiting approval from the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation, which is insuring the mortgage. Once approval is finalized, the deal will be closed with a contractor to renovate the former Milton police station.

The board bought the building from Halton region for \$75,000. The renovations were expected to take eight weeks, but Mrs. Balkind suspects it may take longer since the contractor does a lot of work on schools through the summer months.

As it applies to persons in possession of land within the Town of Halton Hills:

Unless noxious weeds are destroyed by JUNE 23, 1990, and as often as necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owner and collected in the manner of Municipal Taxes.

Goatsbeard, Thistles, Chicory, Poison Ivy, Ragweed, Wild Carrot, and Milkweed are among the weeds considered noxious, and must be destroyed wherever found. Complaints regarding Dandelion and Goldenrod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious under the terms of the Weed Control Act. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted.
